Dear Sir

I was sometime ago favoured with
your most obliging Letter enclosing one from
Mrs Duncan stating her terms for boarding the
young Ladies - your goodness certainly demanded
an earlier acknowledgement from me, but I
was induced to delay it from time to time until
I should be able to inform you of my final de-
termination, which from various causes it
has not been in my power to do sooner. I
have now however determined to send the Child
to Bengal, and a friend of mine Dr Morvie at
Injeram has undertaken to send for her, as
she is in his neighbourhood, and to procure a
passage with a careful Captain from Cochin
