The Editor will consider for publication articles of general or specific science interest. Papers which develop scientific theories based upon scientific principles and/or analysis of data pertaining to Nova Scotia/or Atlantic provinces are particularly encouraged.

## Information for Authors:

Manuscripts submitted for publication must be typewritten, double-spaced, with ample margins. The authors should submit three copies of the paper. The Editor will accept 3/12" disk copies prepared in any word processing format, accompanied by three copies of the manuscript. A brief summary, free of formulae should be included at the beginning of the paper, followed by key words or phrases. References should be collected at the end of the paper, and referred in the text by the author's name and year of publication. The list of references should quote the full title of the journal articles with the first and last page number. Tables should be numbered consecutively with roman numerals in bold type face, must have titles which are self-explanatory and each table must be typed on a separate page.

## **Illustrations:**

Figures are to be numbered consecutively in arabic numerals. Captions for figures should be self-explanatory and be typed on a separate page. Original drawings and a copy are required even when these are embedded in an electronic text. All lines on drawings must be of suitable thickness to reproduce well when reduced to the format of the journal (11.5 x 18.5 cm). Similarly, letters and characters on drawings should be at least 1 mm high (7pt) when reduced to the size used in the journal.

A charge of \$25 per page will be made to help defray the cost of publication. This amount is charged to the institution or a contract supporting the research reported in the published paper. In no case is the acceptance of the paper dependent upon payment of the page charges.
