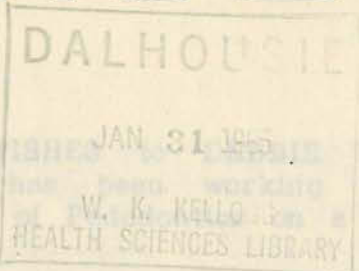

### DENTISTRY DALHOUSIE ANNIVERSARY '75

Celebrations begin in June '82 and continue until October '83.

The XII Biennial Conference on Canadian Dental Research and Education will be held at Dalhousie on June 16 - 21, 1982. It includes research sessions on June 19, 20 and 21, the theme of which is 'Calcification Mechanisms in Bone Tissue and Teeth'. Some of the topics include:

- New Treatment of Jaw Malformation Based on Muscle Bone Interaction
- Remineralization Mechanisms of Enamel
- Osseointegrated Dental Implants A Two Year Clinical Evaluation

There will also be education sessions on June 19 and 20. The speaker for this is Dr. George L. Geis, Director of the Centre for Teaching and Learning Services and Associate Professor (Education) at McGill University. The topic will be 'How People Learn'.

In conjunction with these meetings Dalhousie will offer two continuing education courses on June 18 and 19, 1982.

Issues in Dentistry will focus on topics that affect the profession, although not specific to daily practice. Presentations will be on Manpower, Alternate Delivery Systems, Mercury Hazards and Government Involvement - to name only a few.

**Controversies in Dentistry** will focus on controversial treatment methods in Endodontics, Orthodontics, the role of implants, the use of gold versus base metal alloys in fixed prostheses and radiation in the dental office.
