IT'S STRAWBERRY TIME.....

NO-COOK STRAWBERRY JAM

(Yield: 5 cups)

1 3/4 cups prepared fruit  
(stemmed & crushed)  
4 cups sugar  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1/2 cup pectin

To measured fruit in bowl, add exact amount of sugar. Mix well and let stand 10 minutes. Combine lemon juice and pectin in small bowl; stir into fruit mixture. Continue stirring 3 minutes. Ladle quickly into jars. Let stand at room temperature until set (may take 24 hours). Then store in freezer.

COOKED STRAWBERRY JAM

(Yield: 7½ cups)

3-3/4 cups prepared fruit  
(stemmed & crushed)  
1/4 cup lemon juice  
7 cups sugar  
1/2 cup pectin

Measure prepared fruit in large saucepan, add lemon juice and sugar. Mix well. Place over high heat, bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Stir in pectin. Skim off foam with metal spoon. Then stir and skim for 5 minutes to cool slightly to prevent floating fruit. Ladle quickly into jars. Cover at once with hot paraffin.
