Faculty Appointments

BARRY YOELL '66

Dalhousie University Medical School this year had eight major additions to its staff: three to the Department of Preventive Medicine (including a new Head of Department), two each to the Departments of Physiology and Pathology, and one to the Department of Bacteriology. These additions were:

Dr. Gordon Hatcher:

Dr. Hatcher was born in Montreal and is married with three children. He obtained a B.A. degree from McGill University before graduating with the M.D., C.M. degree in 1944. After service in the R.C.A.M.C. he took the Diploma Course in Public Health at the University of Toronto School of Hygiene in 1947. He later qualified as a certified specialist in the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 1953. For eight years he was on the staff of the School of Hygiene of the University of Toronto as Research Associate and later as Assistant Professor. During this period he did extensive research studies and administrative work in several Public Health Departments. He worked in the health department in Manitoba and did field studies on Hospital and Medical Care Insurance Plans in Manitoba and Saskatchewan. He did the Newfoundland Health Survey in 1949 and was acting Medical Director of the Saskatchewan Indigent Medical Care Programme in 1950. From 1955-57 he was a Special Lecturer at the University of Toronto on a part-time basis and was also Director of the Washington County Project Community Research Associates in St. Louis, Missouri. He was Director of the Chronic Illness Project, Dade County, Miami, Florida, prior to his coming to Dalhousie as Professor of Preventive Medicine and Head of the Department.

Dr. James M. Wanklin:

Dr. Wanklin, a new Assistant Professor of Preventive Medicine at Dalhousie, obtained his B.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Western Ontario; his B.A. is in Psychology and Philosophy and his Ph.D. in Epidemiology and Biostatistics. He then worked at Western with the Departments of Psychiatry and Preventive Medicine in a research project concerning the Epidemiology of Mental Illness. He had several papers published on this theme. He is married and has two children.

Whilst at Dalhousie, Dr. Wanklin is directing a research project in Medical Care Administration, and will be giving lectures on Biostatistics.

Dr. Peter C. Gordon:

Dr. Gordon received his B.Sc. degree in 1949 and M.D. degree in 1955, both from Dalhousie University. Following his internship he practised medicine in Halifax and in Liverpool for six years. He received his D.P.H. from the University of Toronto in 1962 and has been appointed Assistant Professor of Preventive Medicine. Dr. Gordon is married and has two children.

Dr. John Cooper:

Dr. Cooper is a Glasgow University Medical Graduate who interned at the Stirling Royal Infirmary. He took his postgraduate work as a Clinical Assistant and Registrar in the Clinical Research Laboratories of the Victoria Infirmary in Glasgow. He later served in the R.A.M.C. in England, Palestine and Germany. Before coming to Halifax, he worked as Assistant Pathologist at the St. John's General Hospital, Newfoundland and in Glace Bay, N. S.; he is now Associate Professor of Pathology at Dalhousie. Dr. Cooper is married with two children.

Dr. V. W. Krause:

Dr. Krause received his medical education in Alberta, interning at the Royal Alexandra Hospital in Edmonton. He worked in General Practice for four years before entering the Royal Alexandra Hospital as a Resident in Pathology. He subsequently held the position of Fellow in Pathology at the Kingston General Hospital in association with Queens University. He was Resident in Clinical Pathology at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto, the Toronto General Hospital and the Banting Institute. He is married and has come to Dalhousie as Assistant Professor in Pathology.

Dr. Pentti M. Rautaharju:

Dr. Rautaharju is a native of Finland and is married with two children. He received his early education in Finland and graduated from the University of Helsinki Medicine School with the M.D. degree. He has been at the University of Minnesota Graduate School in Biophysics and has completed all the requirements for a Ph.D. in that subject. He was Economist and Manager of the Medical Journal 'Medisiinari' for three years at the University of Helsinki. He held a number of Fellowships during his course of studies, including a Minnesota Heart Association Fellowship for three years. He is a member of a number of learned societies and has had a number of publications of his research work to date. His appointment at Dalhousie University is to the position of Assistant Professor of Physiology.

Dr. Tatsuyu Kanai:

Dr. Kanai, a new Assistant Professor of Physiology, comes from Japan. He obtained his M.D. degree from Sapporo Medical College in Japan, and did his residency training both in Japan and in the U.S. (in California, Utah, Connecticut and New York). He has held several positions in Neurophysiology, including a lectureship at the Tokyo Medical and Dental University, Research Fellow at Albert Einstein College of Medicine and Bronx Municipal Hospital Centre, and Research Investigator in Pharmacology at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, Columbia University, N. Y. He has had a number of papers published on his work.

Dr. Paul Chadwick:

Dr. Chadwick, an Englishman, studied his undergraduate medicine at Guy's Hospital, London University. He received his M.B., B.S., with honours in Applied Pharmacology and Therapeutics. He served as an officer in the R.A.M.C. and was in charge of the bacteriology section of the laboratories at Tel-el-Kebir and the Central Pathology Laboratory, Fayid, Egypt. From 1951 to 1961 he worked in the Public Health Laboratory Service, during which time he received a Diploma in Bacteriology from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. He has several published papers to his credit. Dr. Chadwick now holds the position of Associate Professor of Bacteriology at Dalhousie.
