With deep regret, the *Dalhousie Review* records two deaths that occurred as this issue was going to press.

Charles Frederick Fraser, who died on November 28, 1961, was Editor of the "Review" in 1952-1953. He resigned on retiring from his position as Director of the Dalhousie University Institute of Public Affairs. Mr. Fraser had been Professor of Law at Northeastern University, Managing Editor of the Halifax *Chronicle*, and Canadian Representative on UNESCO. At the time of his death, he was Economic Consultant to the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Dr. Lorne Pierce, who died on November 27, 1961, was a member of the Editorial Advisory Board from 1952 to 1961. As the recognized dean of Canadian publishers, he exercised a unique influence on Canadian literature and education. Among his many honours and distinctions was an honorary degree of Doctor of Laws conferred by Dalhousie University in May, 1960.
