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The Dalhousie Review invites contributions of articles in such fields as history, literature, political science and philosophy as well as prose fiction and poetry from both new and established writers. Articles and works of fiction should not normally exceed 5000 words while the preferred length of poems is less than forty lines. Material should be double-spaced except for quoted matter. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively and typed together at the end of the article. Articles on floppy disk, particularly those using IBM and IBM-compatible systems with Word-perfect, are preferred. Other systems are often acceptable. Material submitted on diskette should be accompanied by hardcopy. Return of diskettes and manuscripts cannot be expected unless accompanied by a self-addressed envelope and return postage in Canadian stamps or International Reply Coupons.
