



ARCHIVAL MATERIAL

- Types of records
 - Text (papyrus, parchment, pulp, etc.)
 - Sound recordings (vinyl, cassette, etc.)
 - Moving images (film, video, etc.)
 - Still images (tintype, print, negative, etc.)
 - Maps
 - Technical drawings
 - Research data
- Advanced notice may be required
- Surrogates or alternative sources may be provided



DEFINITIONS

- Fonds: The entire body of records of an organization, family, or individual that have been created and accumulated in the course of that creator's functions or activities.
- <u>Collection</u>: A grouping of documents of any provenance intentionally assembled on the basis of some common characteristic.



DEFINITIONS

- Provenance: The person(s), family (families) or corporate body (bodies) that created and/or accumulated and used records in the conduct of personal or business life.
- Reference code: the unique identifier used to request archival material.
 Reference codes are assigned based on provenance.



FINDING AIDS

- Archives create "finding aids" for each fonds or collection
- Dalhousie finding aids are fully searchable online
- The level of detail varies widely
- Some finding aids contain "embedded" digitized material


