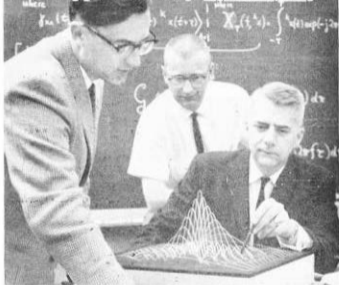

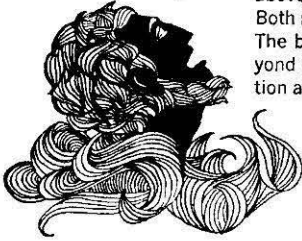

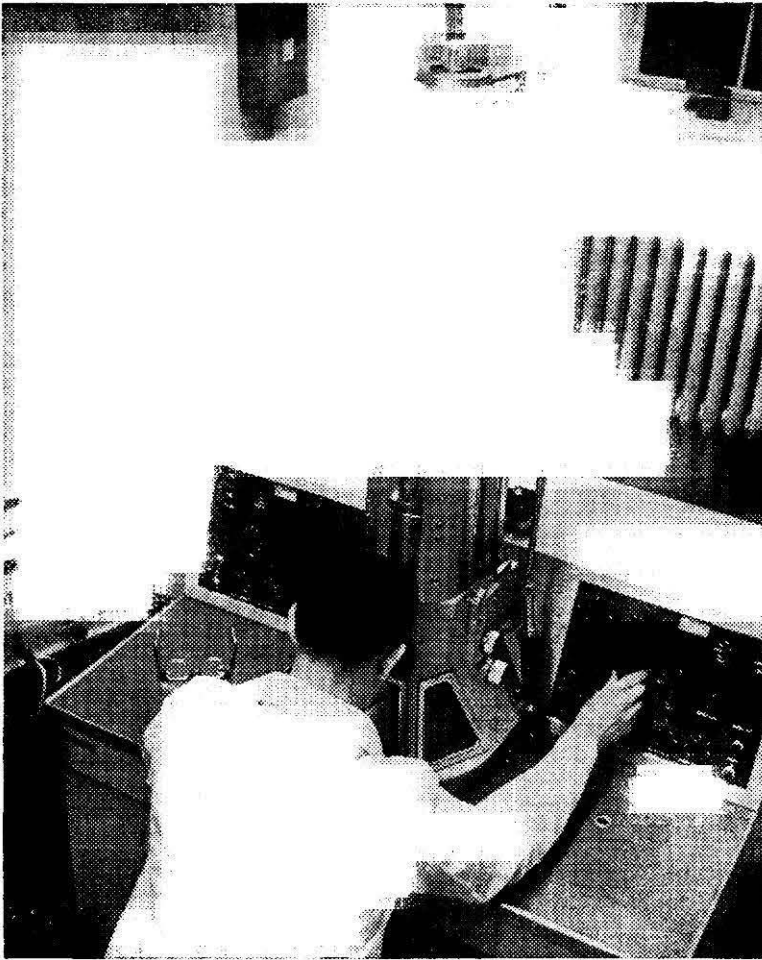

**Dalhousie University Medical School** has a new electron microscope, which can produce photos showing an enlargement of 1,000,000 the original linear measurements. This \$50,000 instrument is the third of its kind, and the largest, used at the university.
