Editor's Desk

The December 1986 *Bulletin* was to be the Quebec theme issue; however, the submissions as organized by Nadine Corbel merit more pages than our budget would allow. Thus after some delay it has been decided to use the *Bulletin* to publish material of a general interest. In the meantime we will be seeking additional funding to allow a larger March 1987 issue. A list of the Quebec articles is found on page 15 and to our readers I can only advise that the wait is well worth it for the excellent research which Nadine has gathered together.

The Proceedings offers a paper given at the Landscape Architecture Session of the 1985 S.S.A.C. Conference held at Bishop's. Edwinna von Baeyer examines the Canadian City Beautiful Movement in Ontario during the period of 1880 to 1920.

The book review by James St. Clair of Terry Sunderland's *Still Standing, Cape Breton Buildings From Days Gone By*, was provided for the Maritime issue but not published owing to lack of space. James St. Clair of Mull River lives in an 1871 farm house which, interestingly, is featured in Sunderland's book. St. Clair is Past President of the Federation of Nova Scotian Heritage and is Assistant Professor, Community Studies, University College of Cape Breton.

In 1987, the S.S.A.C. Annual Conference will be held from 28-30 May in Toronto. A call for papers was recently sent to all members. Abstracts in English or French not exceeding 250 words are required by 25 January 1987 to Stuart Lazear, Vice-President, S.S.A.C., P.O. Box 2302, Station D, Ottawa, K1P 5W5. The sessions are:

- I Modern Architecture of the Post-War Period, 1945-65
- II Interrelationship of Art and Architecture
- III The Architecture of Toronto
- IV Architecture and Popular Culture
- V The Cultural Landscape of Canada's National Parks
- VI Panel Discussion, The Evaluation of Heritage Buildings.

As previously indicated Volume 12, Issue No. 1 will be the Quebec theme. The problem of budget restrictions, nevertheless casts a foreboding shadow over the *Bulletin*.
