SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS



Submit manuscripts in triplicate (original and two copies) to Prof. Margalith Galun, Department of Botany, The Dr. George S. Wise Faculty of Life Sciences, Tel Aviv University, Ramat Aviv, Tel Aviv 69978, Tel. 972-3-5459163. Telex 342171 VERSY IL, BITNET EEEM@TAUNOS, FAX 972-3-419513.

Manuscripts should be organized and prepared in the style of the journal.

Figures should be printworthy, and if possible, reduced to a size suitable for appearance in the journal. The printed area will be 12×19 cm. In photographs use bars to indicate magnifications.

Please give full address of all authors and include telephone and telex numbers.

The paper should begin with an abstract.

Keywords describing the article should be supplied as well as a brief running head.

REFERENCES

References should be listed alphabetically at the end of the manuscript in the following style:

ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION

It is possible to submit manuscripts on computer tapes, floppy discs or preferably by electronic transmission by BITNET, ARPANET (code EEEMQTAUNOS). This shortens the time of processing and production. This should be done in addition to (not instead of) sending the manuscript in the traditional manner.

REFEREES

All manuscripts will be judged by independent referees. Authors may submit a list of names of potential referees or, in case of possible controversy, to suggest who should not referee their paper. It should be understood that editors are not bound by these suggestions.

COVER PHOTOGRAPHS

Cover photographs will be selected from the current issue. However, the editor would be pleased to receive additional photographs of special interest to symbiotic associations. Photographs in duplicate and with a suitable brief caption and acknowledgement should be submitted to the editor.

PROOFS

Authors will receive proofs, which they are requested to correct and return as soon as possible. Authors should keep a copy of their manuscript, as proofs will be sent to them without manuscript. Authors making major revisions in proof will be required to bear the cost thereof.

REPRINTS

Twenty-five reprints will be supplied free of charge to the author(s). Additional reprints can be ordered at prices shown on the reprint order form which will accompany the proofs.
