The Associates, visiting the Metropolis, have a right of Admission into the Libraries and Reading Rooms, and on application to the Clerk, may have a Ticket of personal admission to any of the Lectures, under such regulations as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board of Managers. The Associates have a right of sending to the Institution any Specimen of Materials, or other substances, which they think may be useful in Manufactures or Agriculture, to be examined,

and if necessary, analysed and reported upon, and their probable applications stated. All Associates shall have the right of adding the letters A. R. I. to their names.
