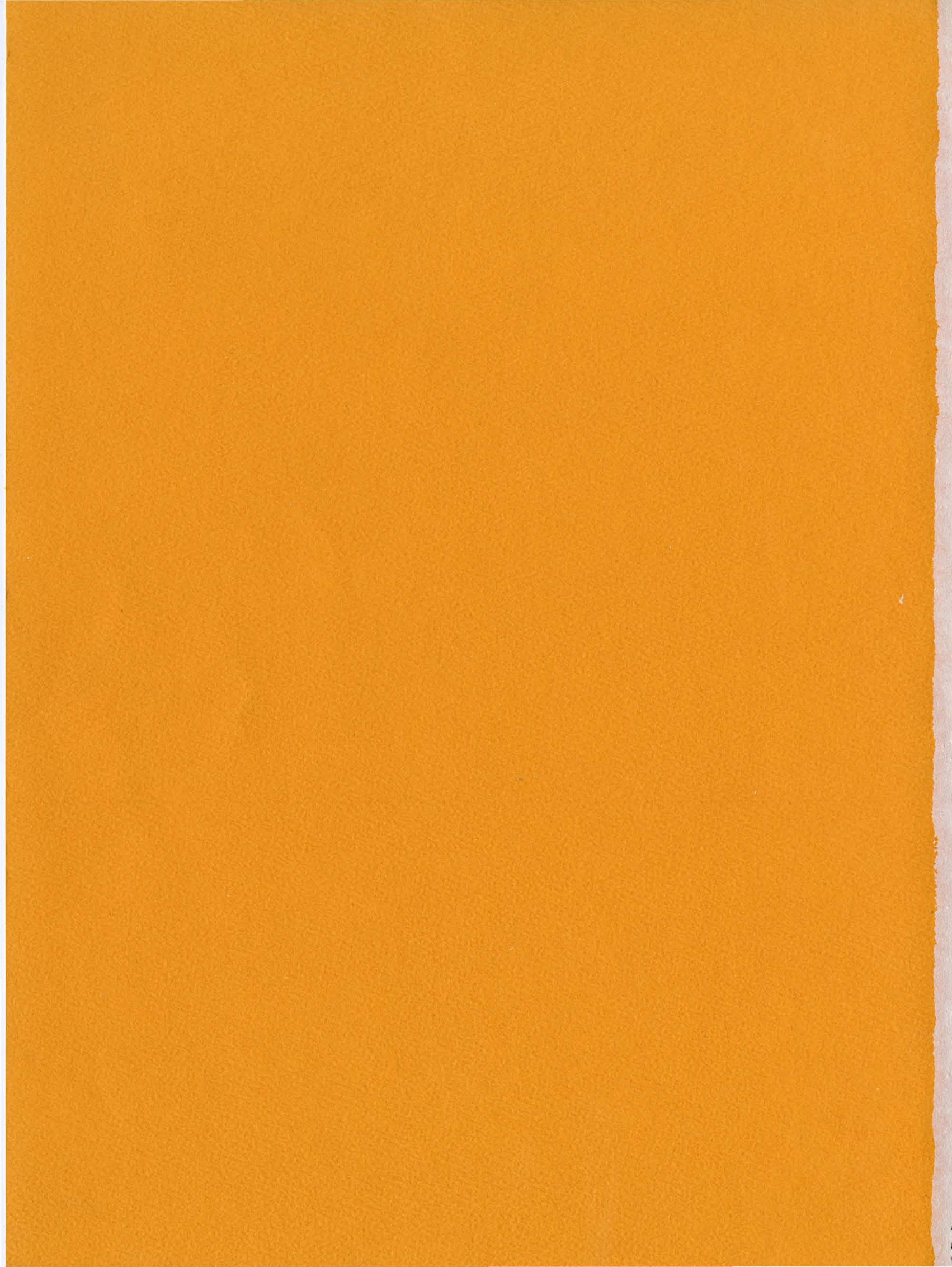

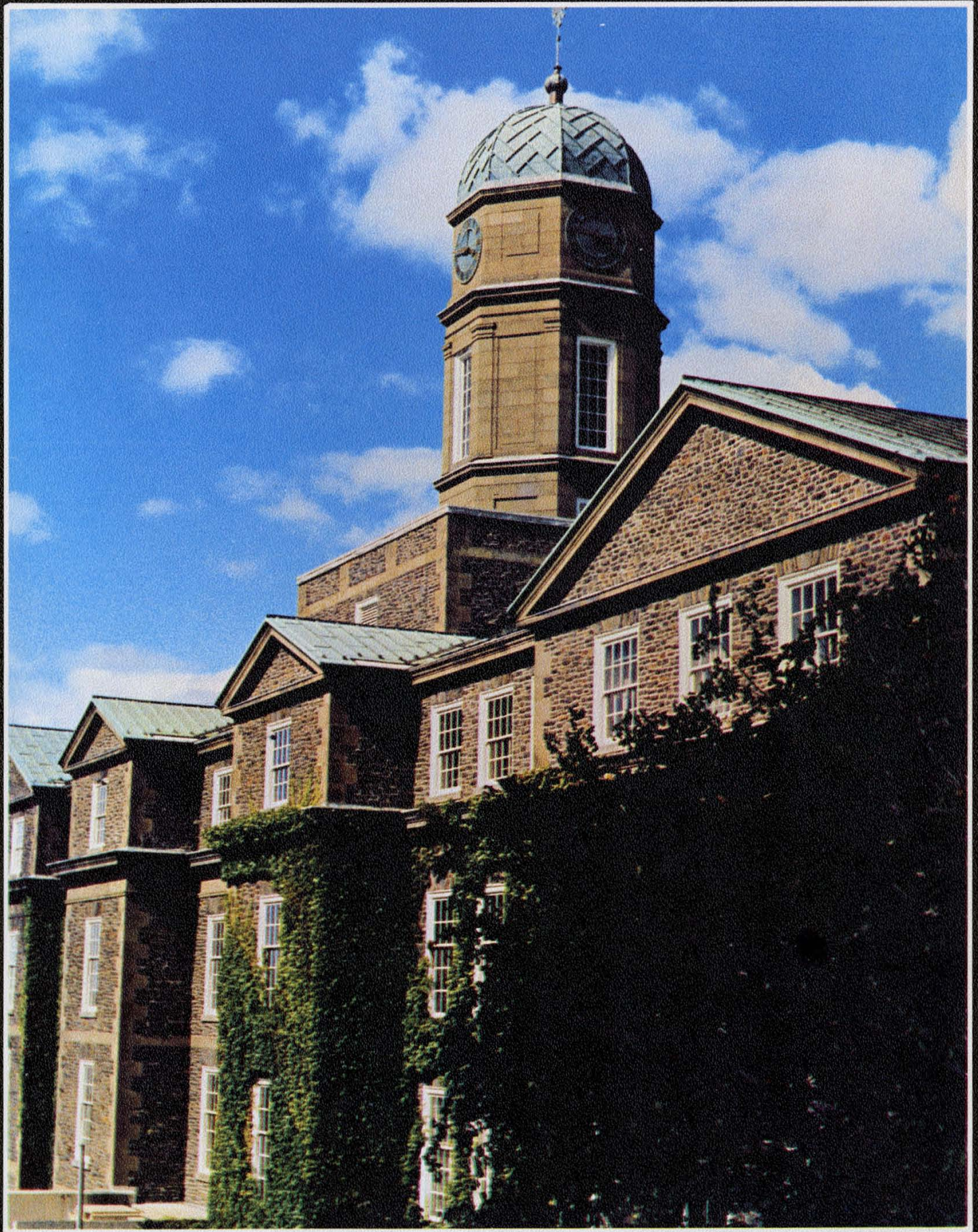



TO THE CLASS OF 1975:

The Reverend Doctor James Ross, Dalhousie's President in 1875, did not need to write a farewell message to his Class of '75. He could, and probably did, shake hands with all twelve of them! The President one-hundred years later is grateful for this opportunity offered by the Editor of PHAROS to bid a warm good-bye to the Class of 1975, approximately seventeen hundred strong.

It is the hope of those of us who have contributed in one way or another to your programme of studies while at Dalhousie, that in the years ahead we may hear well of you whether your field of activity is one that draws public attention or whether you contribute quietly and steadfastly in some way to the welfare and happiness of your fellows.

I urge you to keep in touch with your university, through the Alumni Association or however you may choose. We need your support and helpful criticism that Dalhousie may continue to be a significant part of the Canadian University scene.

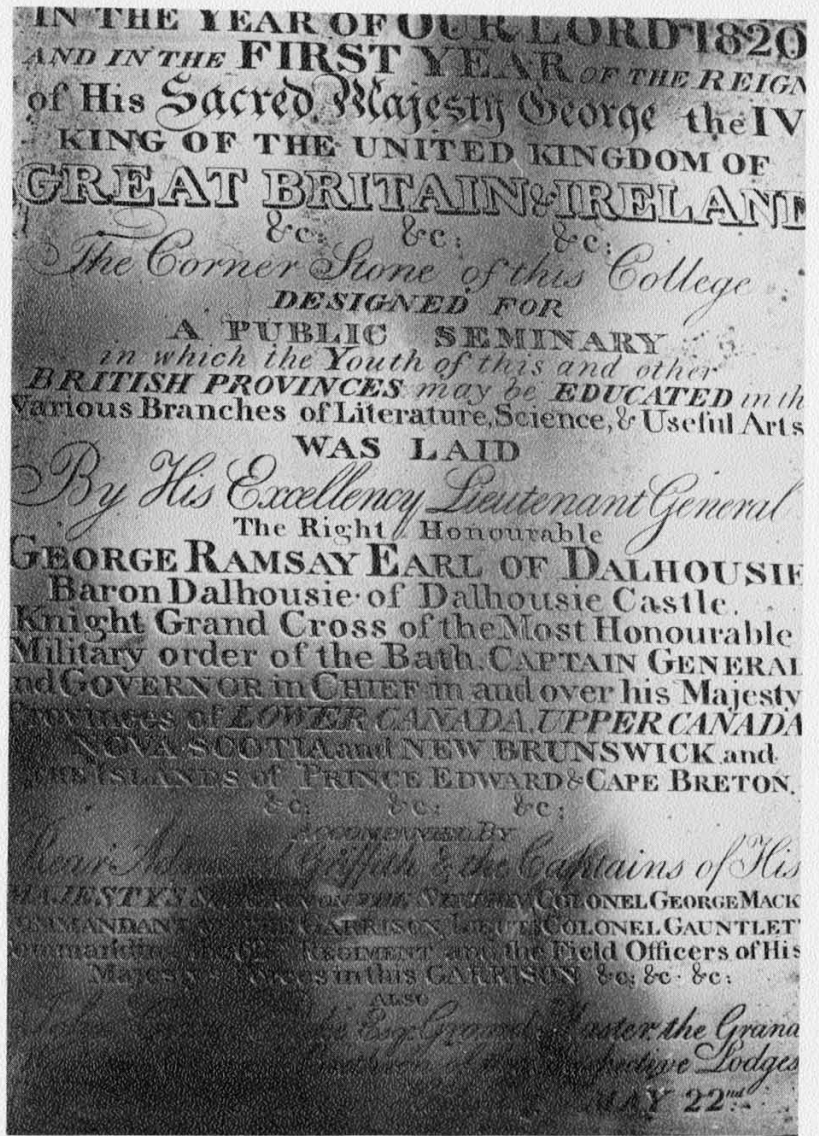

George Ramsay, ninth Earl of Dalhousie

“Before I proceed in this ceremony, I think it necessary to state to you, gentlemen, the object and intention of this important work; I think it necessary to do this because I have never yet made any public declaration of the nature of the Institution I am here planting among you, and because I know that some part of the public imagine that it is intended to oppose the college already established at Windsor. This College of Halifax is founded for the instruction of youth in the higher Classics and in all Philosophical studies; it is formed in imitation of the University of Edinburgh; its doors will be open to all who profess the Christian religion; to the youth of His Majesty’s North American Colonies, to strangers residing here, to gentlemen of the military as well as the learned professions, to all, in short, who may be disposed to devote a small part of their time to study. It does not oppose the King’s College at Windsor, because it is well known that college does not admit any students unless they subscribe to the tests required by the Established Church of England, and these tests exclude the great proportion of the

youth of this Province. It is therefore particularly intended for those who are excluded from Windsor; it is founded upon the principles of religious toleration secured to you by the laws, and upon that paternal protection which the King of England extends to all his subjects. It is under His Majesty's most gracious approbation of this institution that I meet you here today, and as his humble representative I lay this corner-stone of the building. I here perform an act which appears to me to promise incalculable advantages to this country; and if my name, as Governor of the Province, can be associated with your future well-being, it is upon the foundation of this college that I could desire to rest it. From this college every blessing may flow over your country; in a few months hence it may dispense those blessings to you whom I now address; may it continue to dispense them to the latest ages! Let no jealousy disturb its peace; let no lukewarm indifference check its growth! Protect it in its first years, and it will abundantly repay your care!"

Dalhousie University was founded as the result of an idea of George Ramsey, ninth Earl of Dalhousie, Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia in 1817, that a university be open to any student, regardless of class or creed. The funds used to begin construction of the university were obtained from customs duties acquired by the British during their period of occupation of Castine, Maine in 1814.

The original site of Dalhousie University was the Grand Parade, where Halifax City Hall now stands. On May 22, 1820, the Earl of Dalhousie laid the cornerstone of the first Dalhousie College.

The buildings were ready for occupation in 1823, but the professors had not been chosen, and even the early supporters of Dalhousie were becoming apprehensive, believing that King's College in Windsor was sufficient as an educational centre. As a result, the college was closed and served as a community centre from 1829 to 1838. There were two attempts to

amalgamate with King's College, but both failed. Eventually, Dalhousie came to function as a college, in 1838, with Reverend Thomas McCulloch as President until 1843.

There were only three possible chairs at Dalhousie when it opened, classical languages, mathematics and natural philosophy, logic and rhetoric. The first class consisted of twelve students, which later increased to sixteen. The courses lasted four years with the tuition being \$20, \$24, \$12, and \$6 respectively.

When President McCulloch died, the college again closed. It remained so until enough funds accumulated, which was in 1848. A Board of Governors was appointed by Joseph Howe, with Sir William Young as Chairman. During the period between 1840 and 1860, Dalhousie College became a high school named Dalhousie Collegiate School and later, Dalhousie High School.

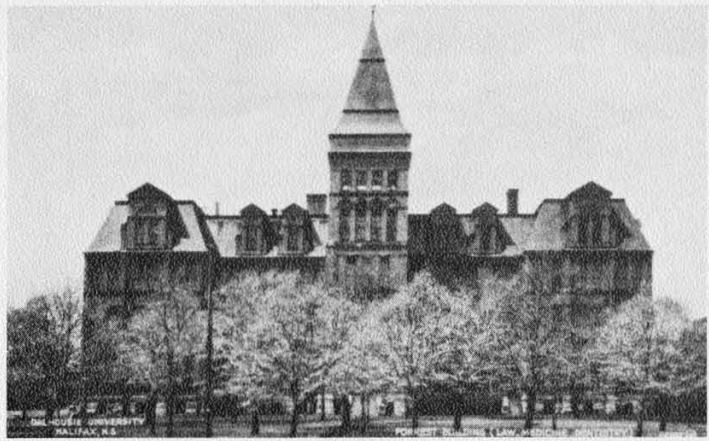
In 1863, Dalhousie had a second President, Reverend James Ross. President Ross resigned

in 1885 and he was succeeded by Dr. John Forrest, who, with his brother-in-law, Mr. George Munroe, founded five new chairs. They were Physics, History, and Political Economy, English Literature and International and Constitutional Law and Philosophy. Munroe donated \$350,000 which was used to erect new buildings and to improve the quality of the teaching staff. Mr. Munroe's generous grant was honoured with the proclamation of an annual University holiday in his name.

In 1882, due to a bequest of Alexander MacLeod, the chairs of Classics, Modern Languages and Chemistry were founded. Dalhousie moved to Carleton St. in 1886 where the Forrest Building was built housing the Faculties of Law, Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy and Biology. In 1912, for \$50,000, the Studley Estate was purchased and here the Science Building (now the Chemistry Building) and MacDonald Library were constructed.

Between 1920 and 1930, Sheriff Hall and the Law Building were completed. During the 1930's the Gymnasium and the Medical-Dental Library were built. The 1950's saw the construction of the Arts and Administration Building and the Memorial Rink. In the early 1960's, the Dunn Building was constructed, now housing Physics and Geology, and the Sir Charles Tupper Building, the new medical institute. The fall session of 1970 saw the completion of the beautiful Isaac Walton Killam Memorial Library where the faculties of Mathematics and Languages, and the Computer Centre are located. The following year, the elegant Arts Centre opened, containing the Rebecca Cohn Auditorium. The vast Life Sciences followed in 1972, and it now incorporates the Biology, Oceanography, and Psychology departments.

As Dalhousie celebrates its 158th anniversary, plans are in the making for further expansion of the educational facilities. Specifically, these plans include the erection of an Athletic Complex, Physical Sciences Centre, and Dentistry Building.

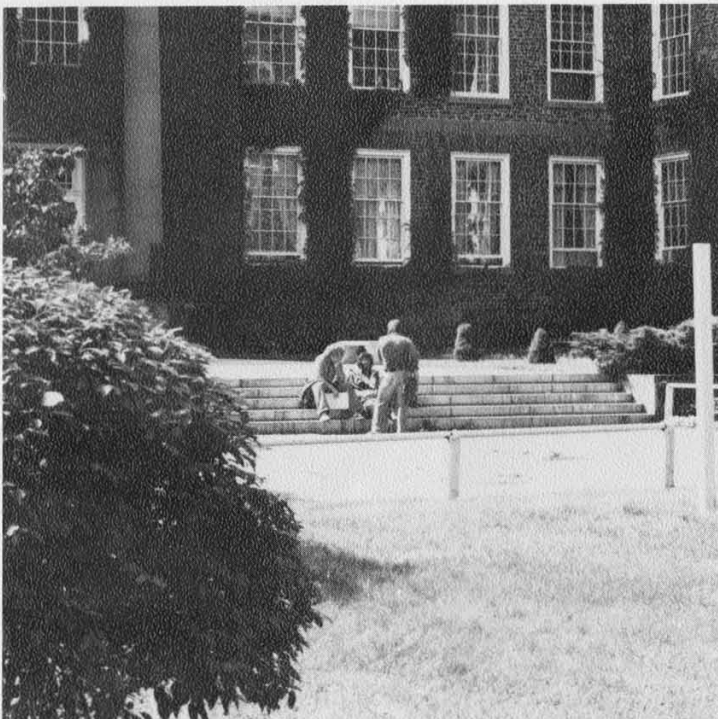


The Forrest building became Dalhousie's new campus at the turn of the century.

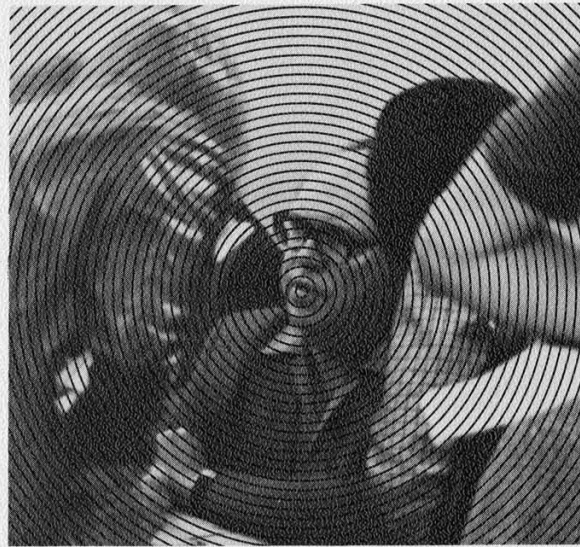


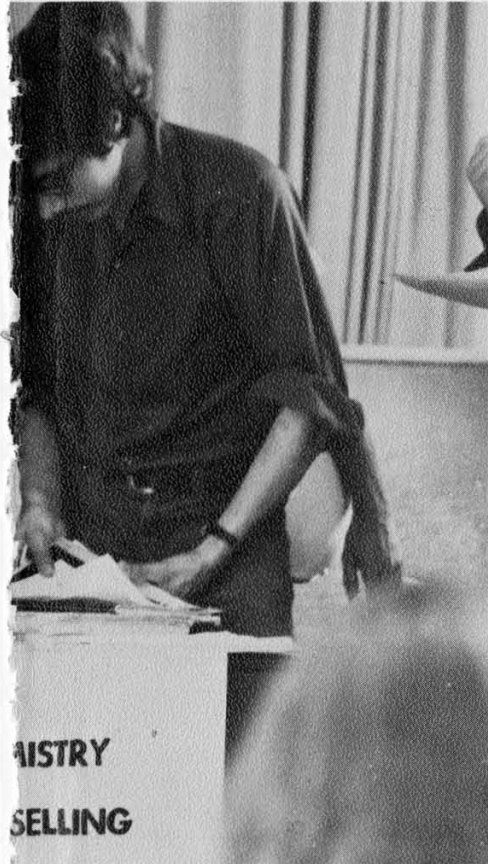

The peaceful summer days of Dalhousie came to an abrupt halt with the commencement of registration during the second week of September.

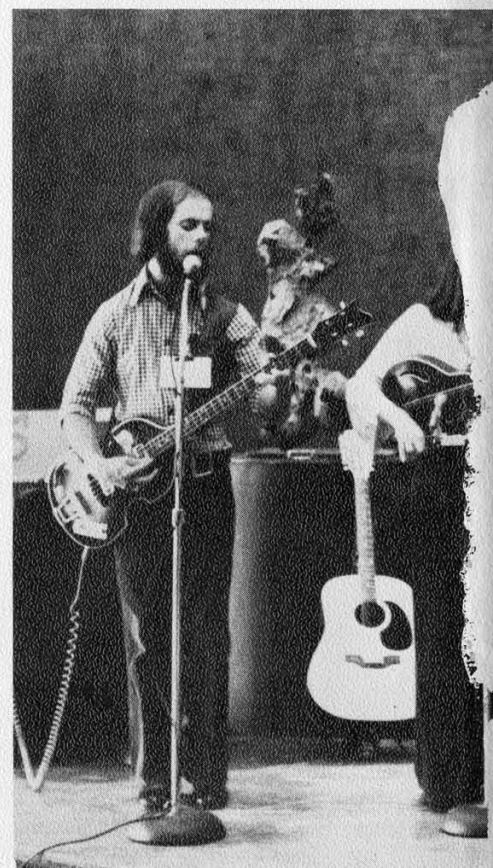


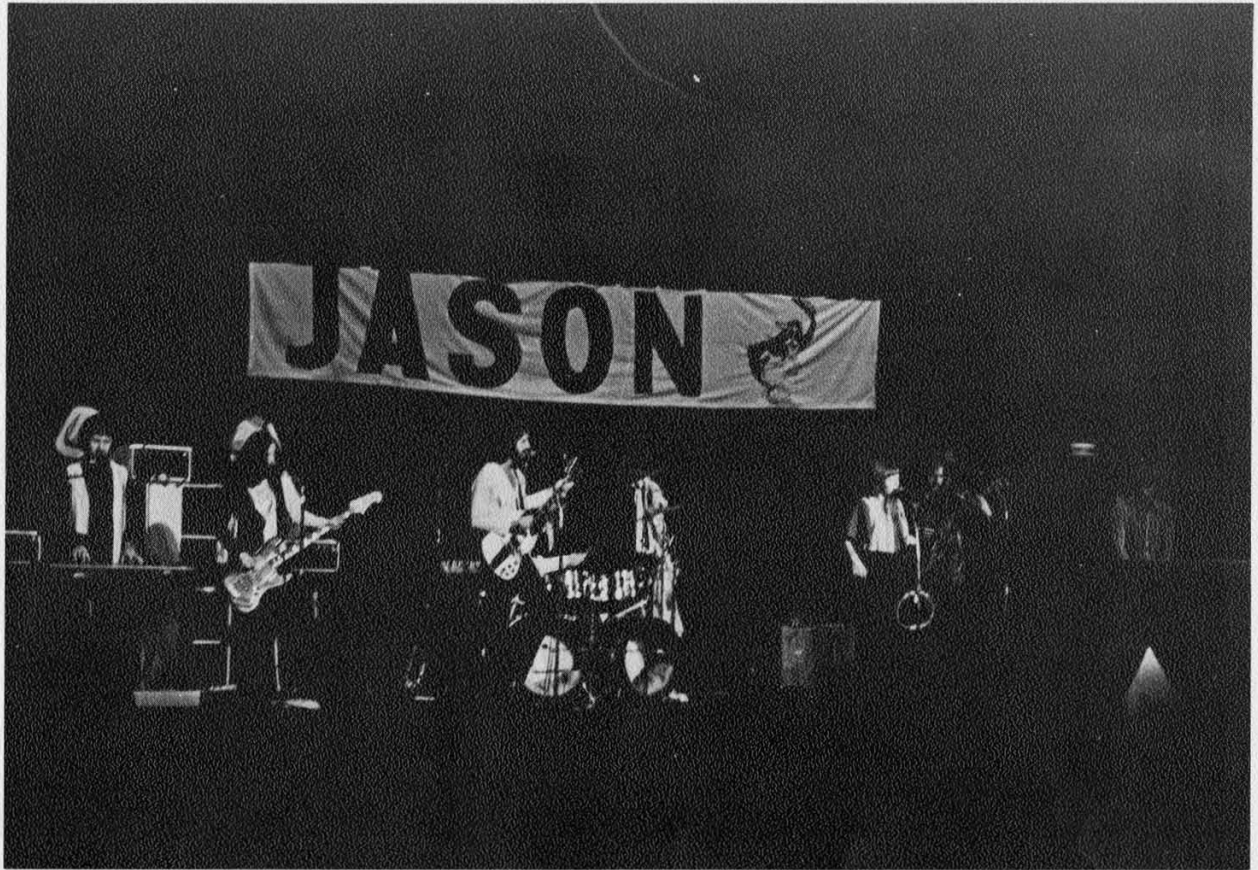




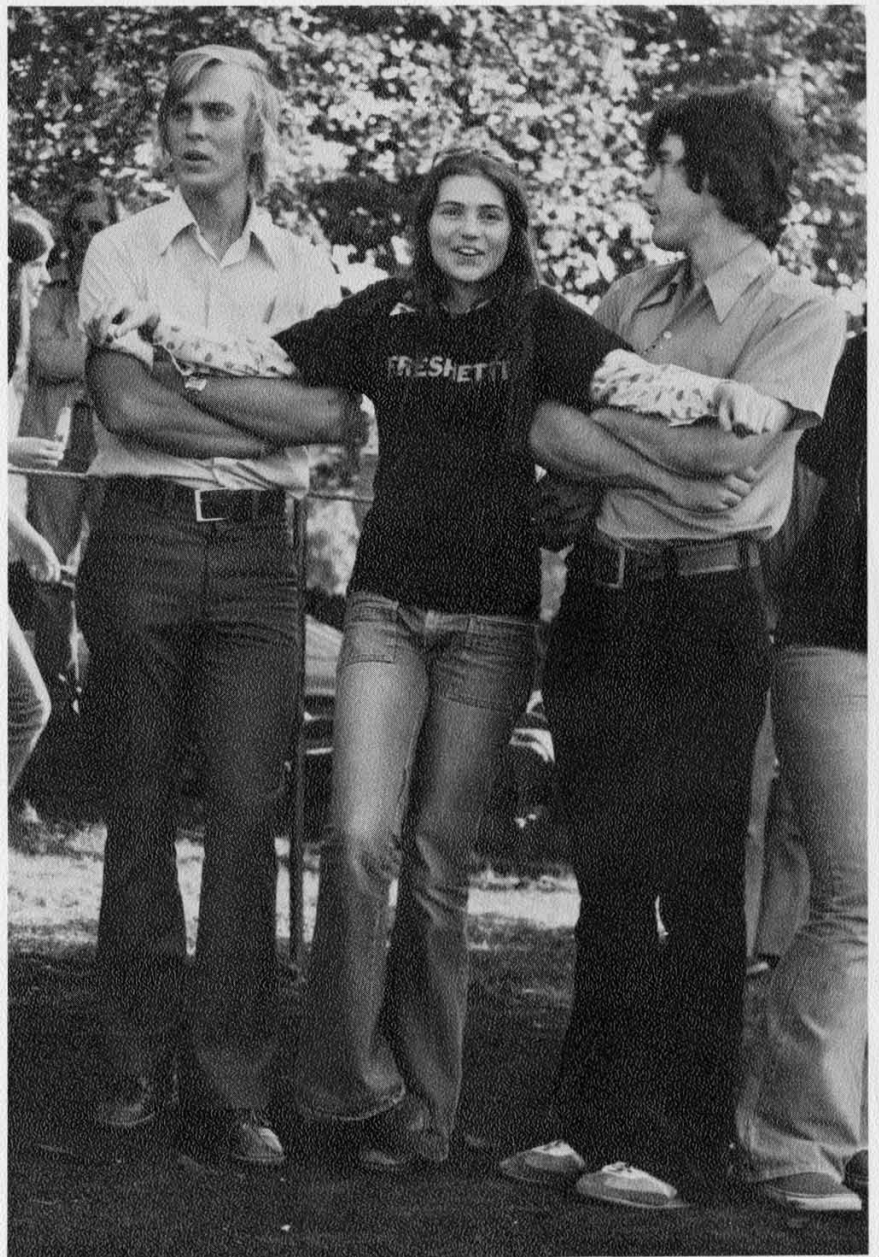
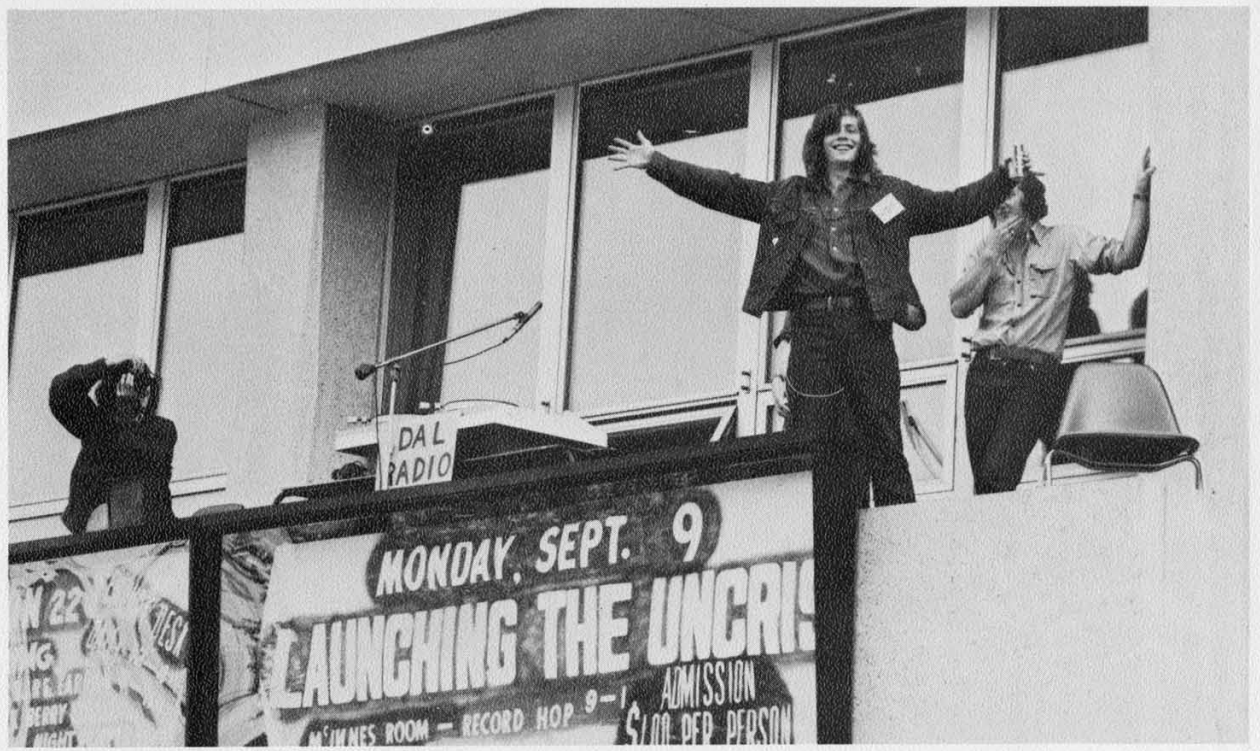
Gazette Editor Peter O. Clarke bribed prospective newspaper staff with free balloons.

important, winning, or seeing that everyone plays? These questions will no doubt be answered before the start of the 1975 season.





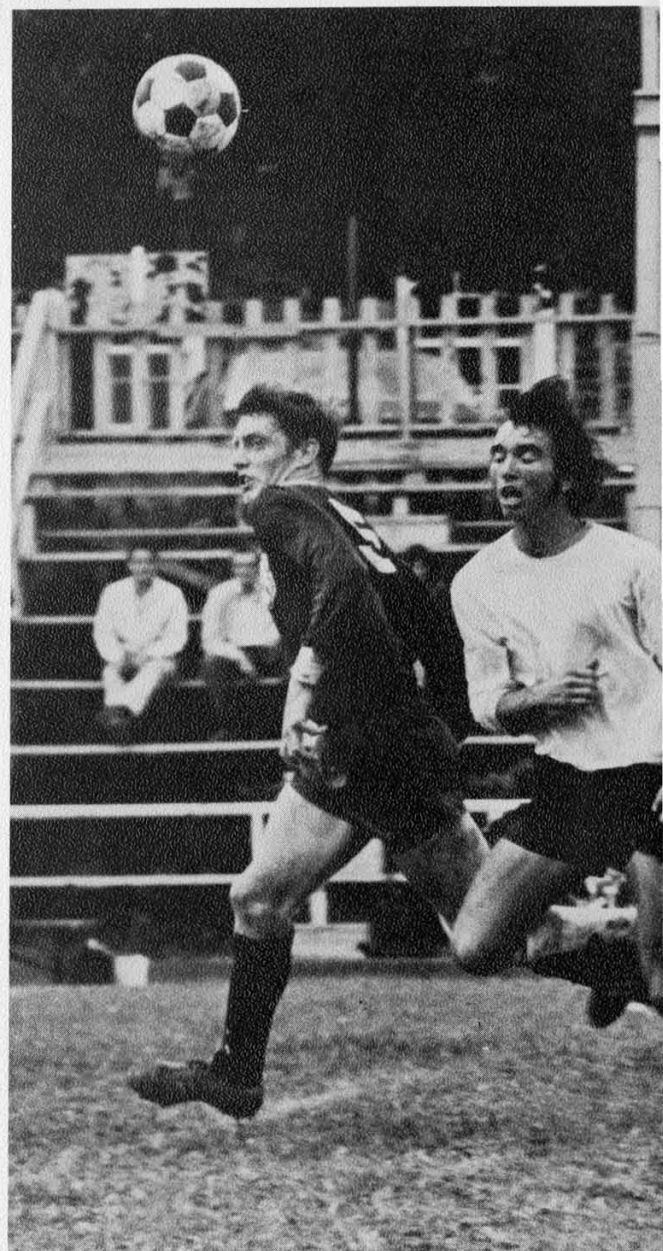




The Dalhousie soccer club of 1974 displayed a most impressive calibre of play throughout the season and dominated league contests. A coordinated attack, spirit, and hard work on the part of every individual enabled coach Tony Richards and his Tigers to enjoy such a successful year.

The team carried their momentum into the playoffs and in the first round disposed of U.N.B. by a 2-0 margin with Kevin Mayo scoring both goals. The title game saw Dal, in the early stages, able to withstand considerable pressure exerted by Mount Allison Mounties and then outthrustle their opponents to a 1-0 victory. The goal by Bob Moss brought the first Maritime Intercollegiate Soccer Championship back to Dal since 1969 and qualified the team to participate in the national championships held in Montreal. A superb performance by the club permitted it to progress as far as the semi-finals where they suffered defeat, by a single goal, to the powerful U.B.C. squad. However, the team was victorious in the consolation round by downing the Manitoba Bisons for the second time in the tourney. Previously considered to be underdogs, the players earned respect for their team and for the Atlantic Conference as a whole.

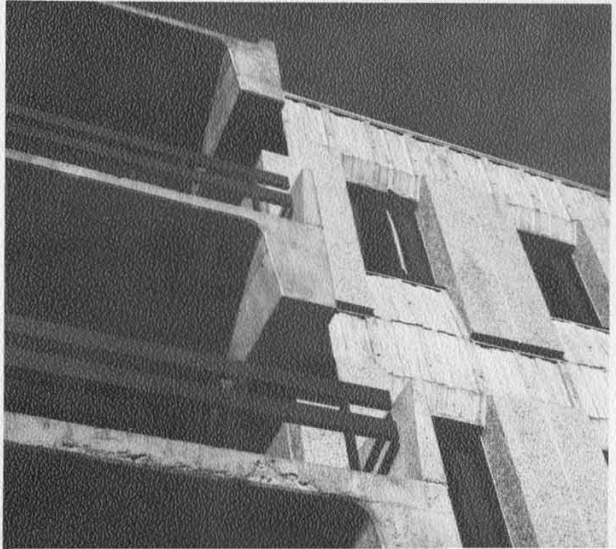
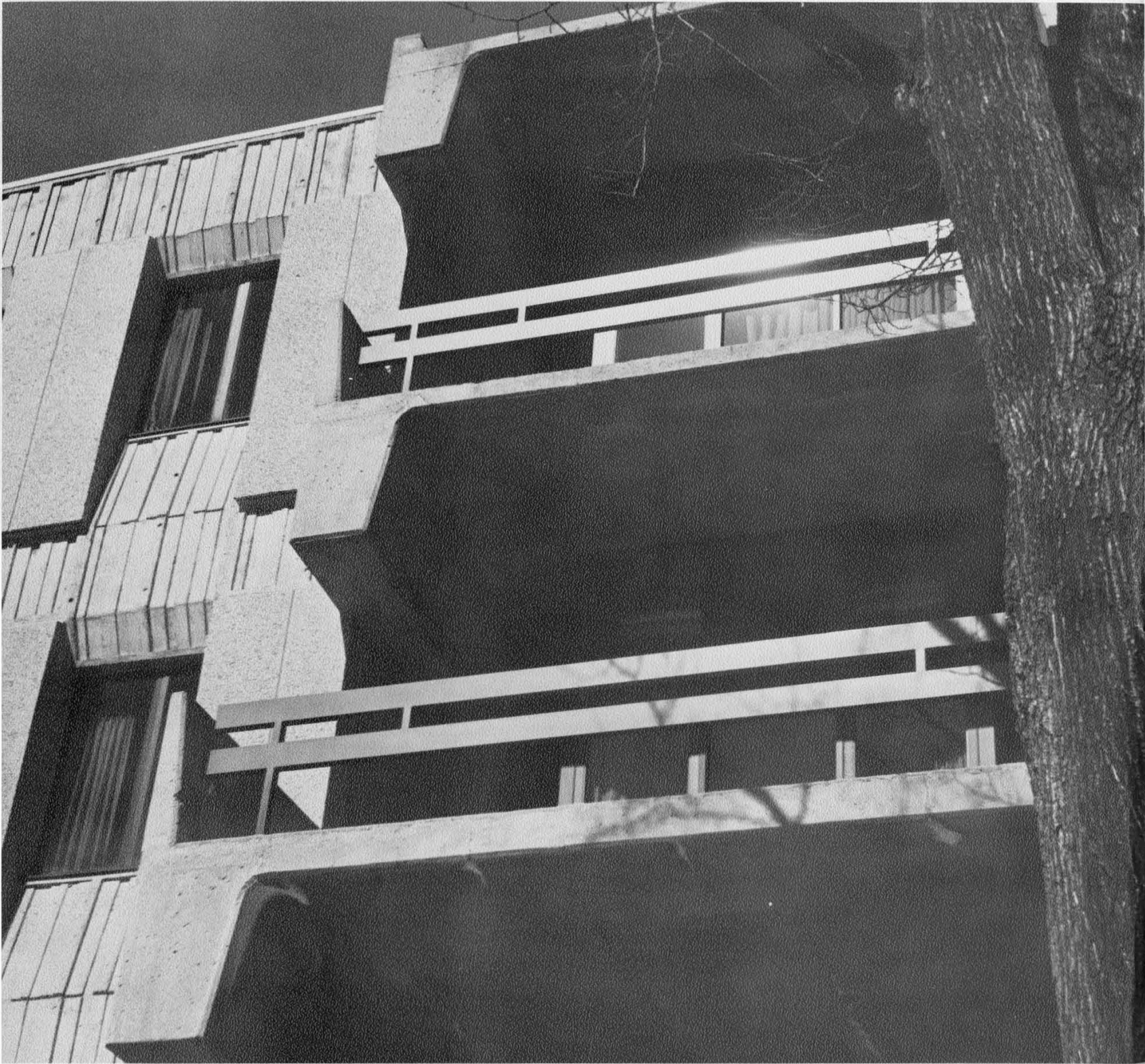
Next year's Tigers will undoubtedly be as successful and perhaps, with more enthusiastic fan support, a national title will be in store.



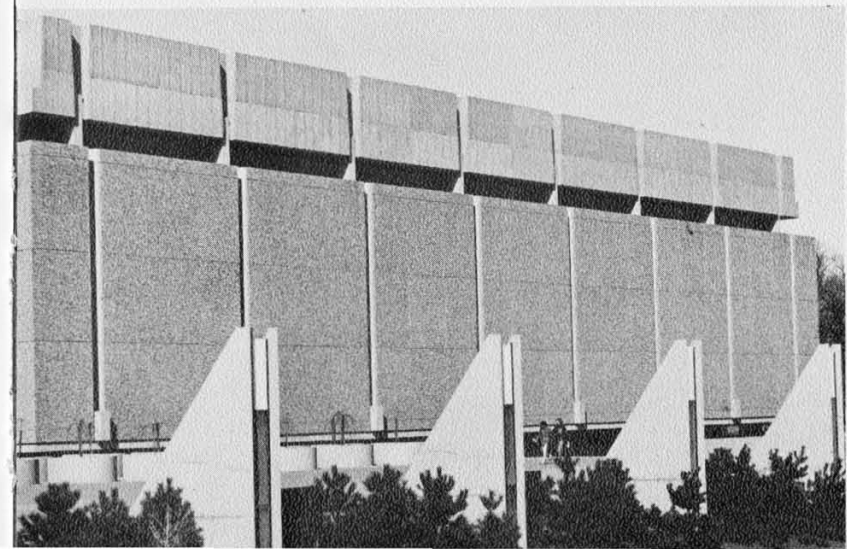
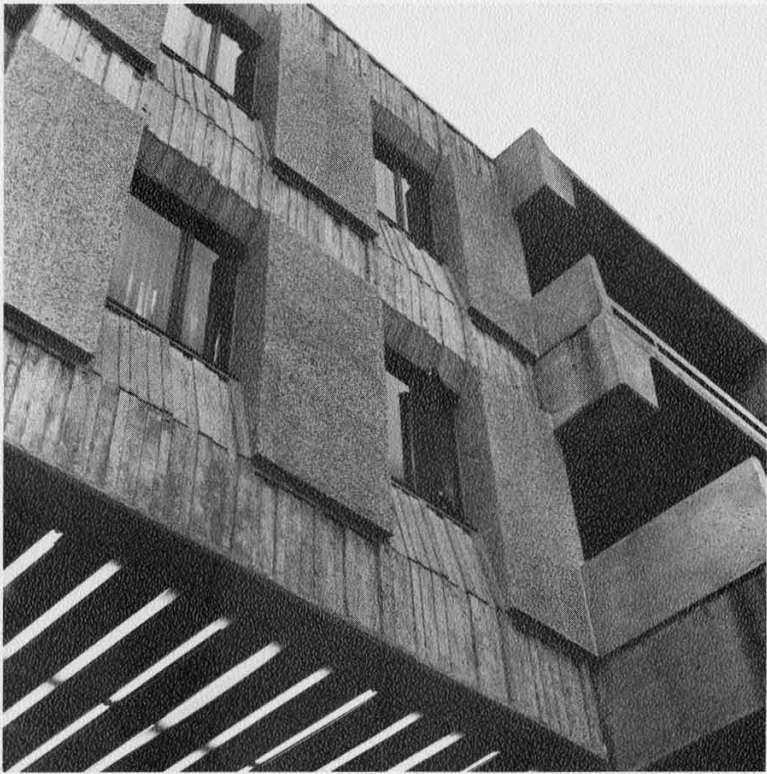


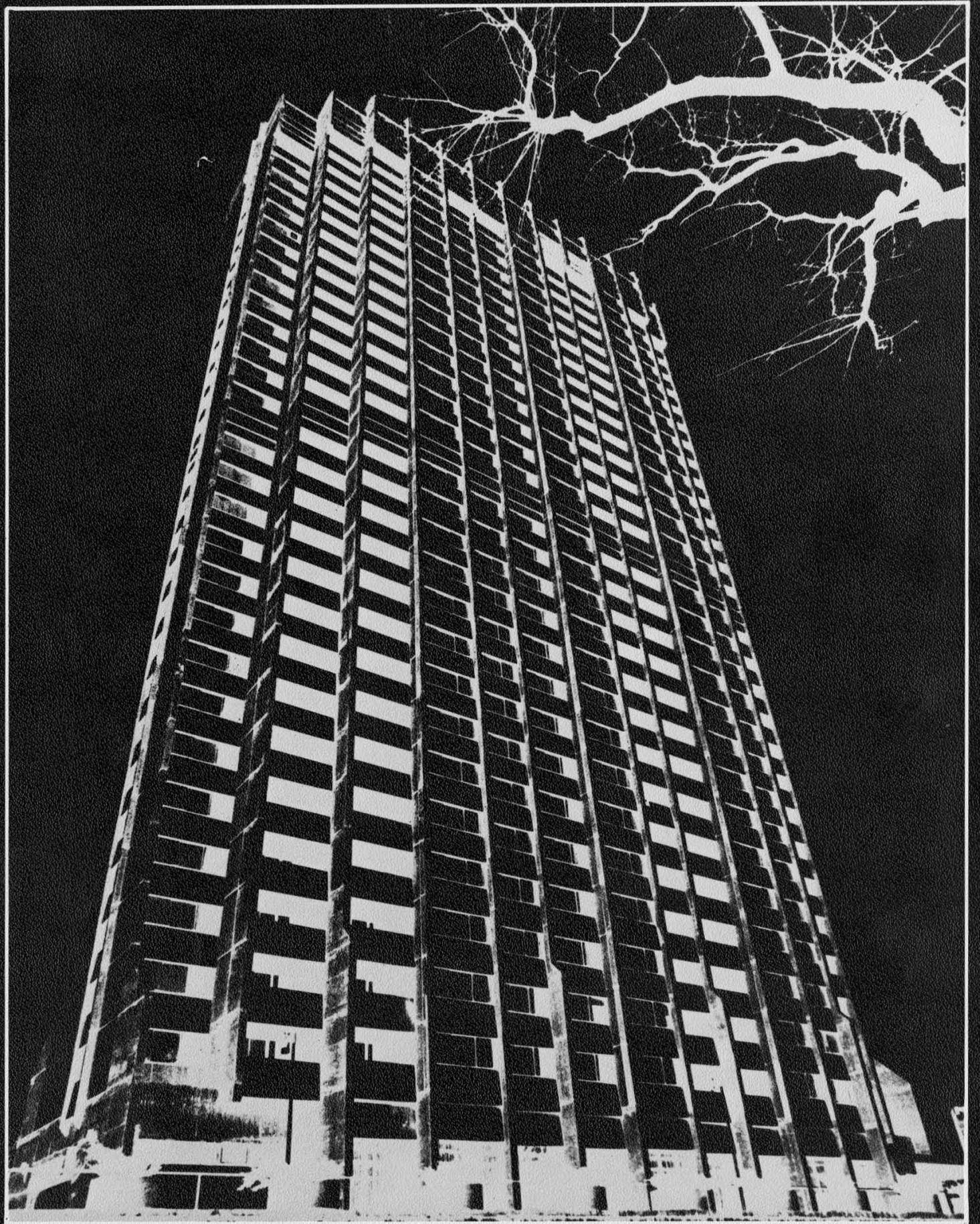


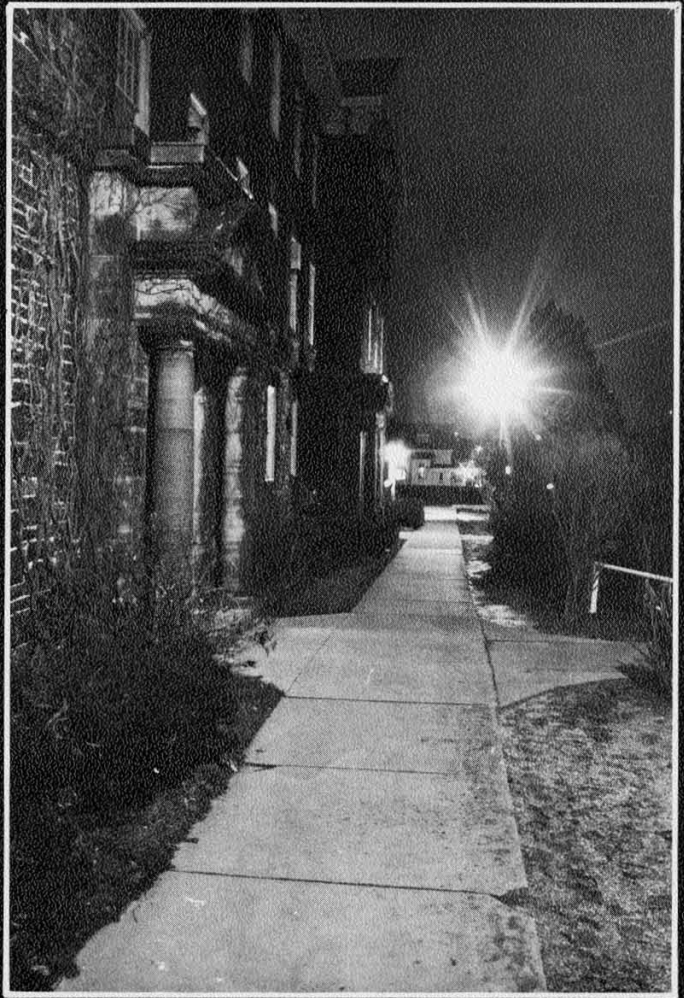
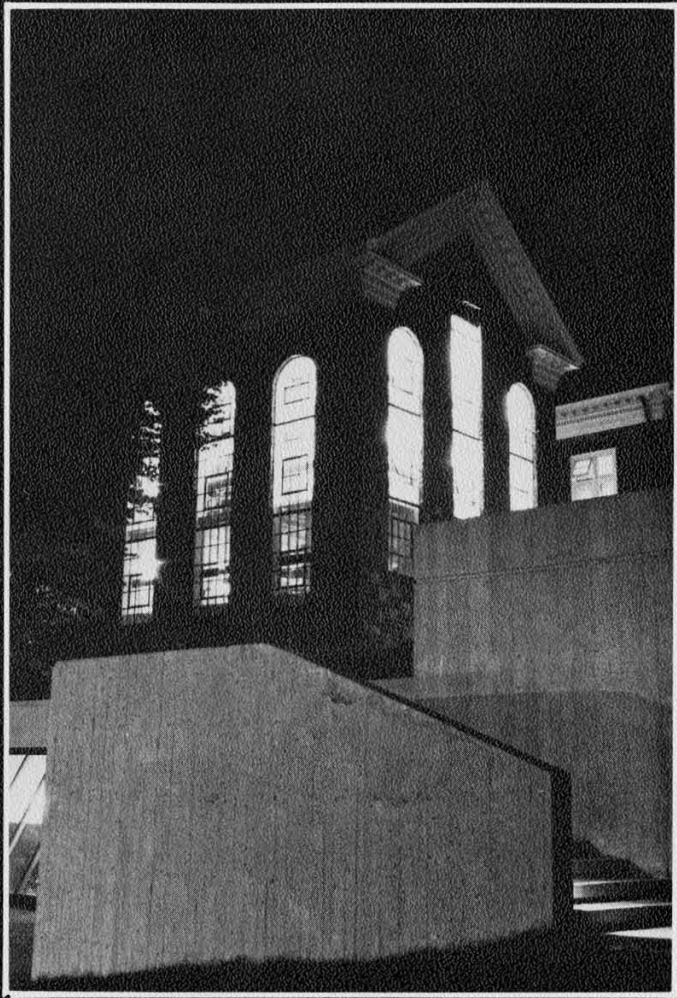

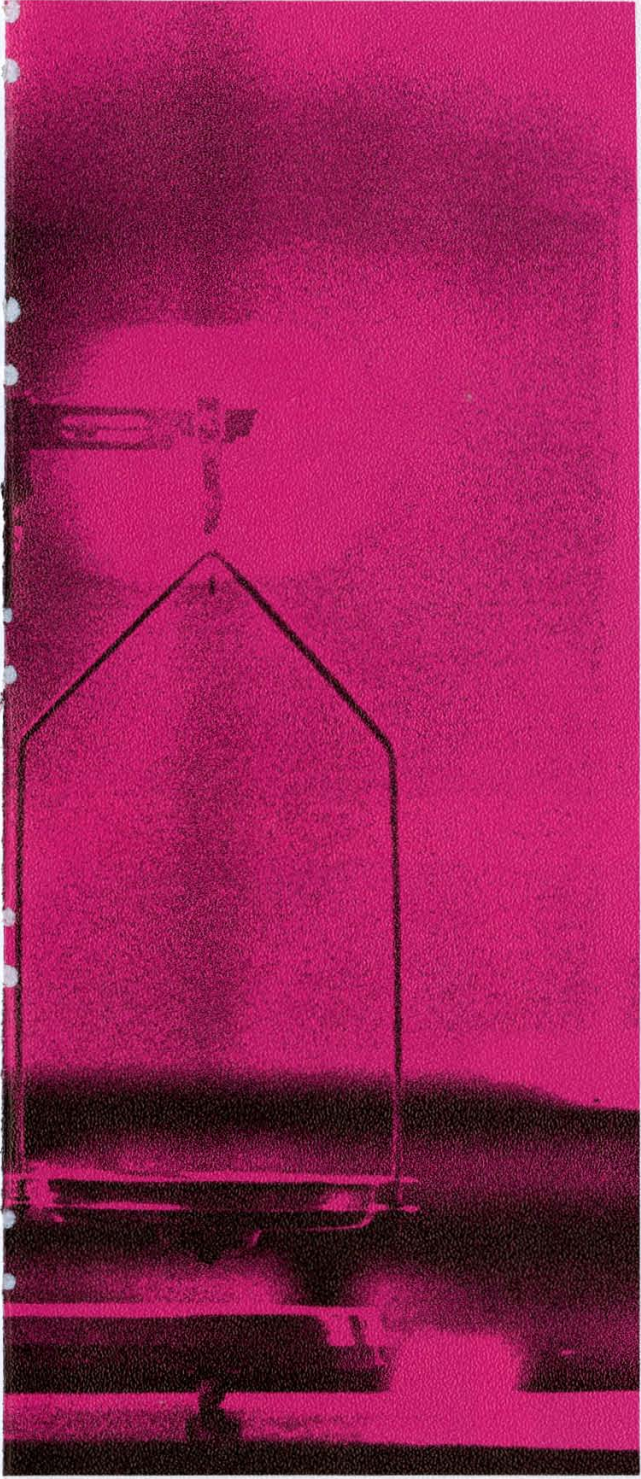


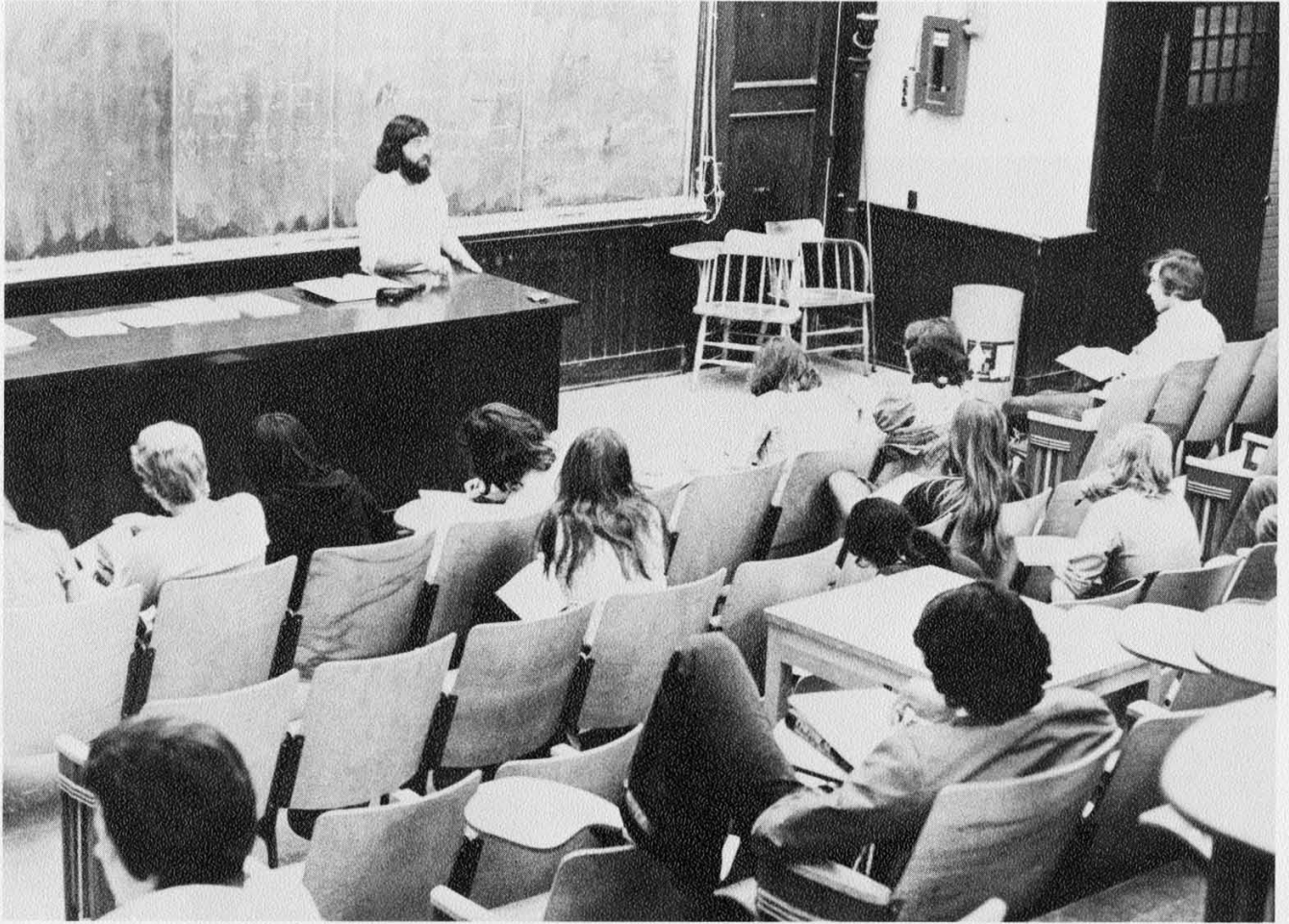


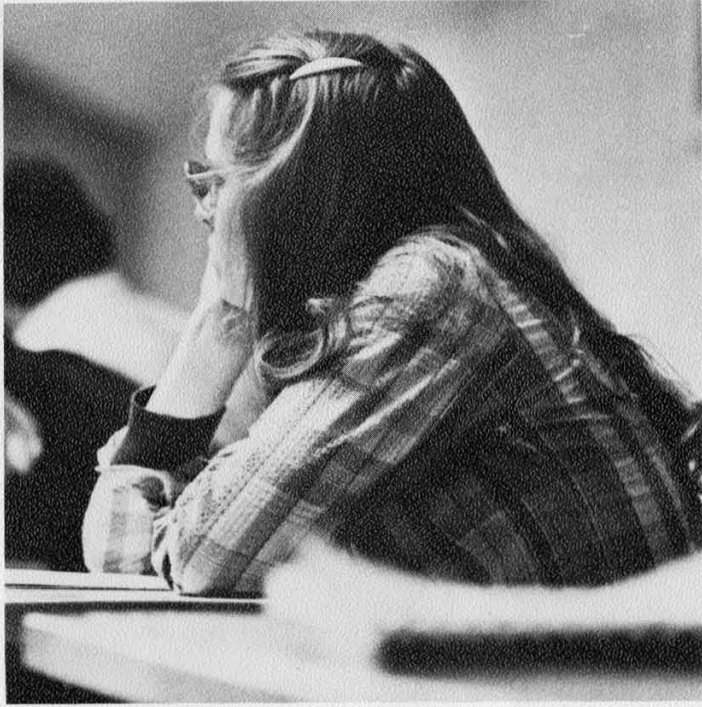


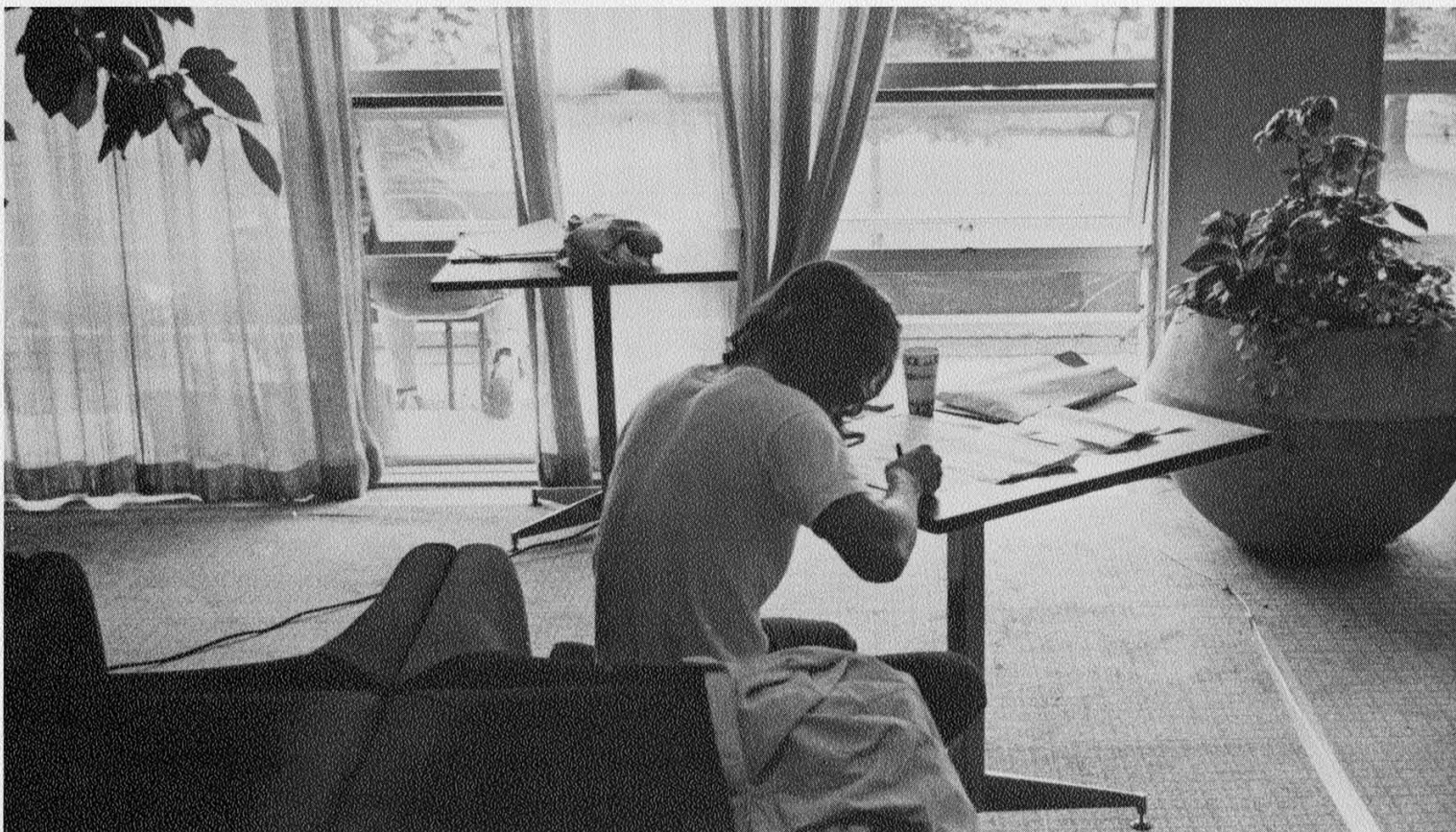
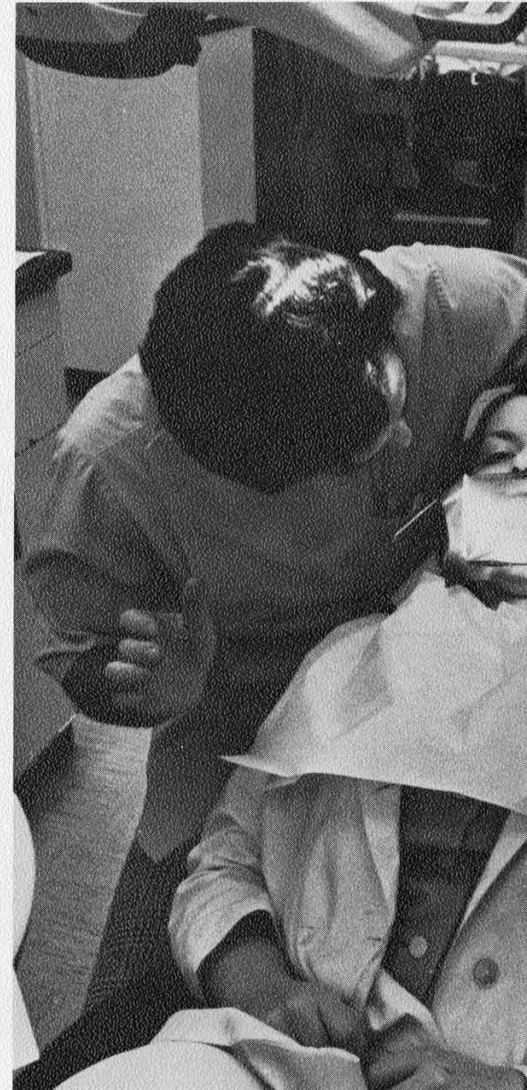
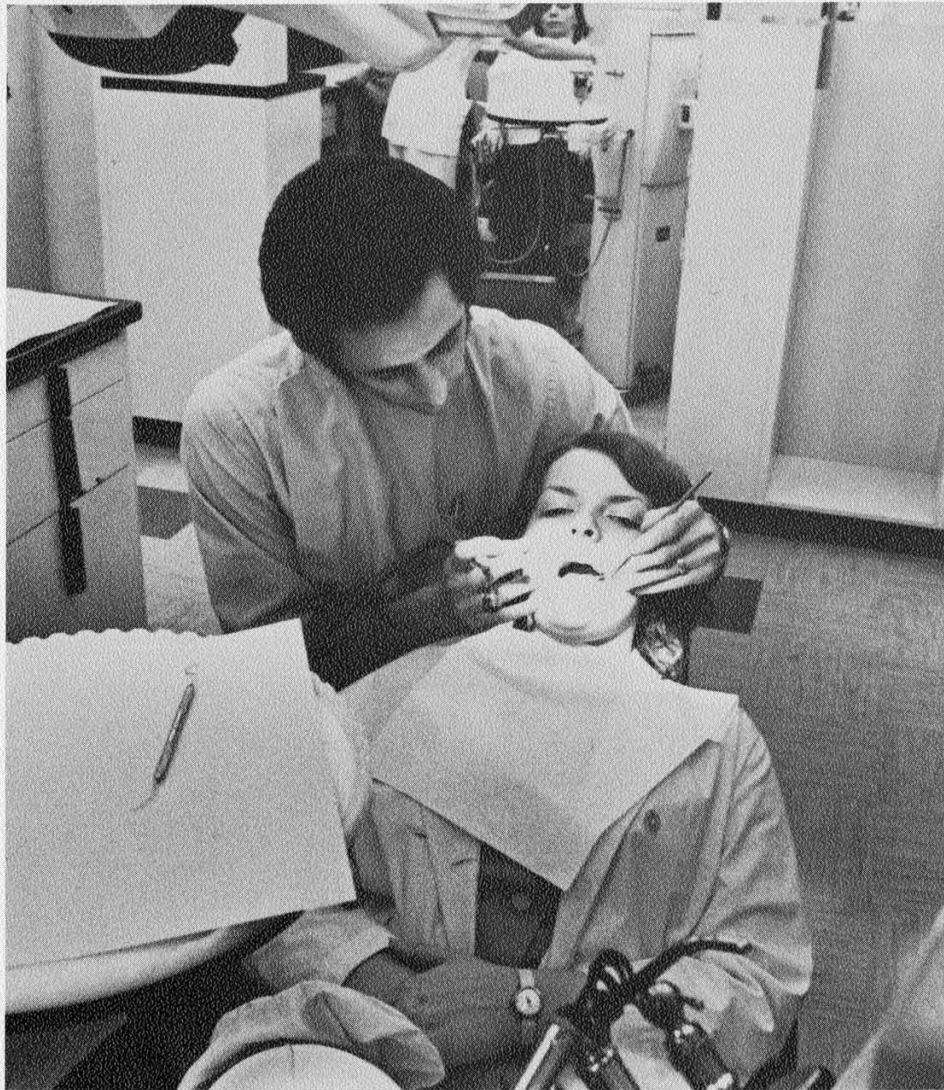


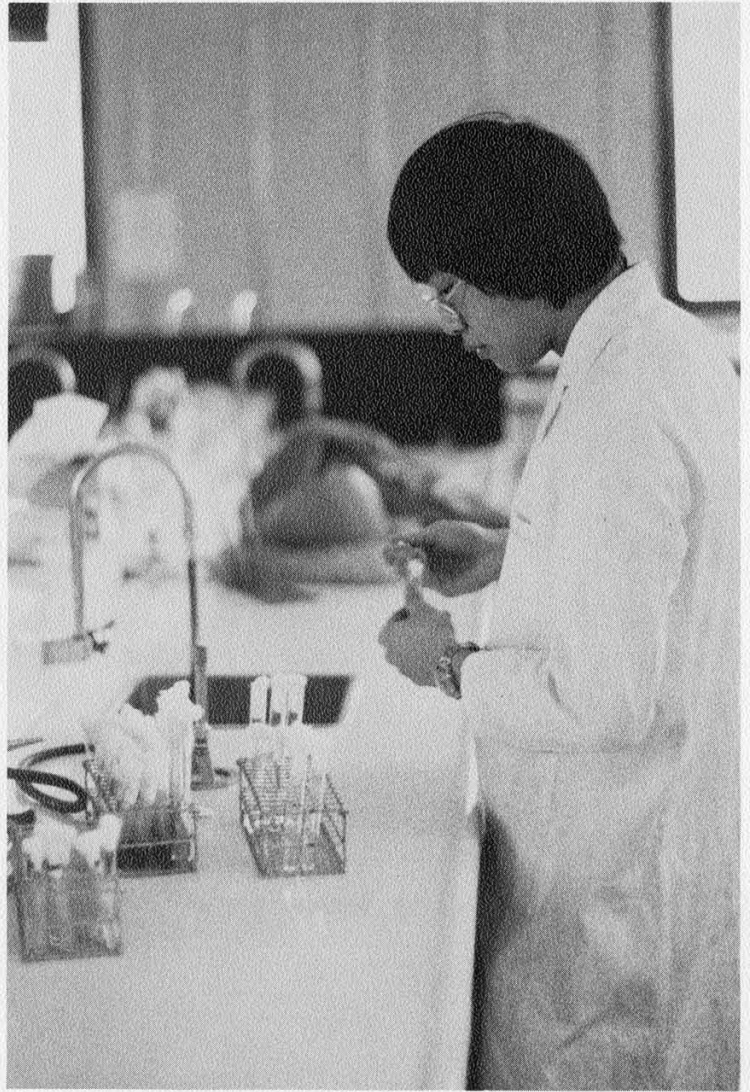


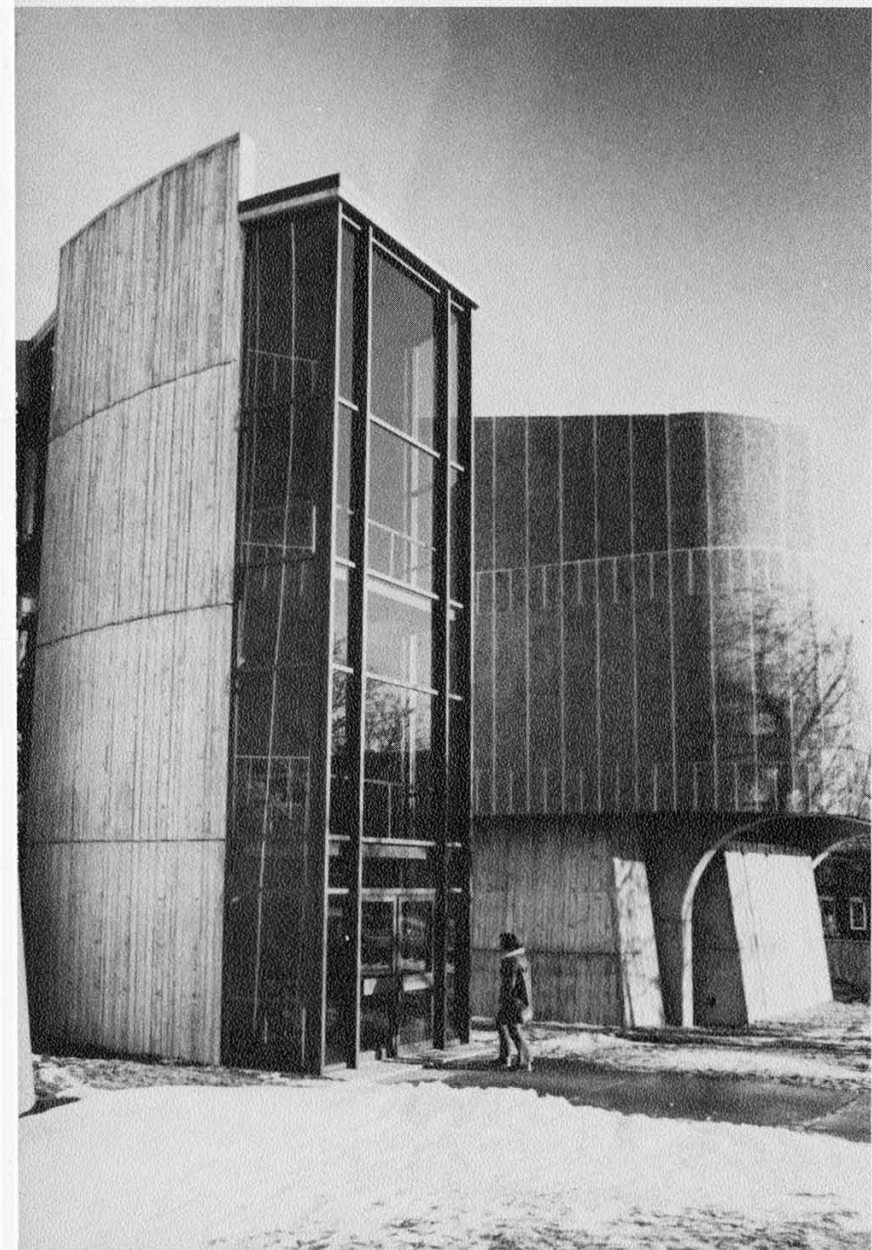


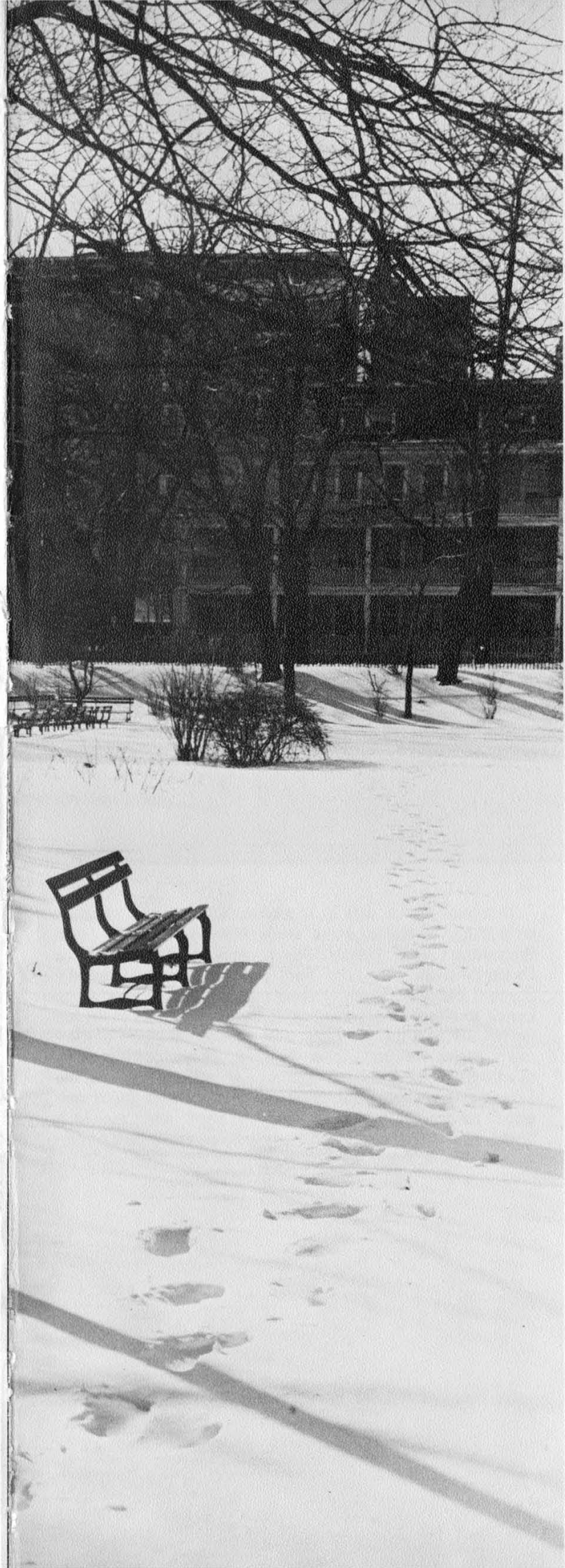










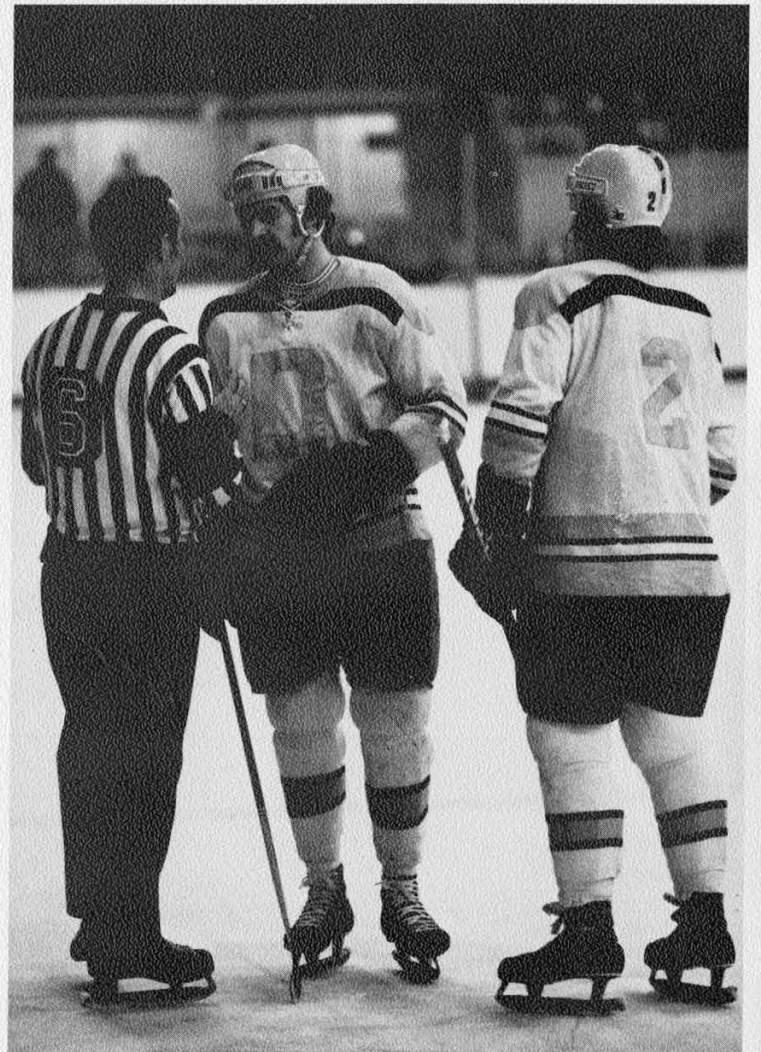
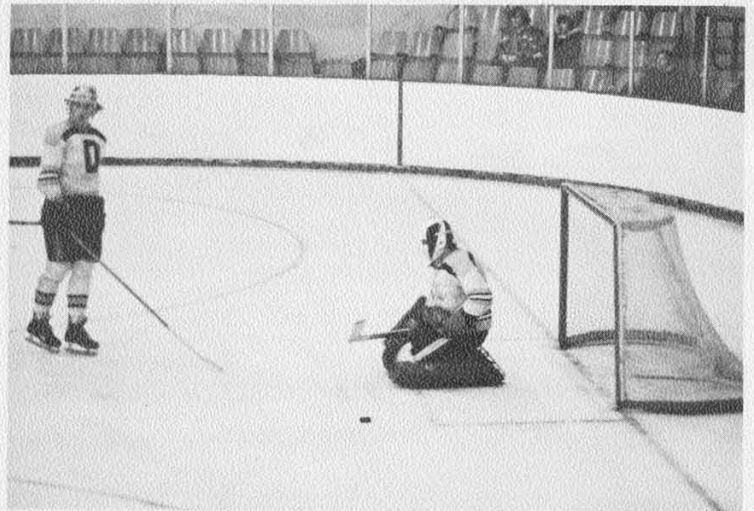
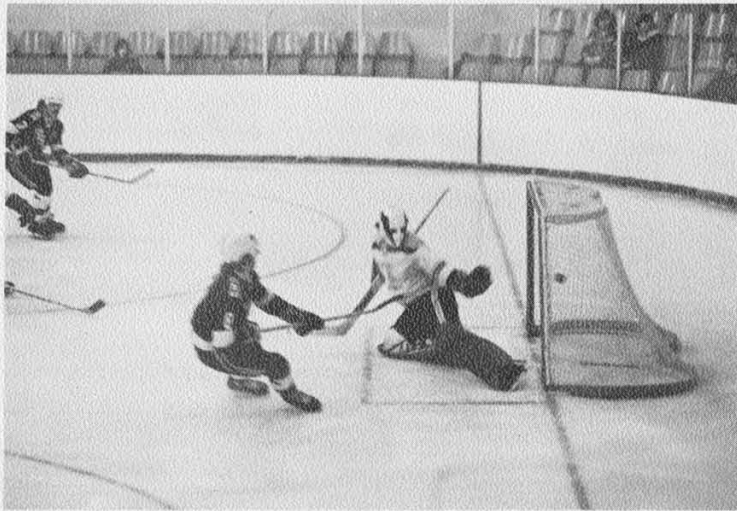


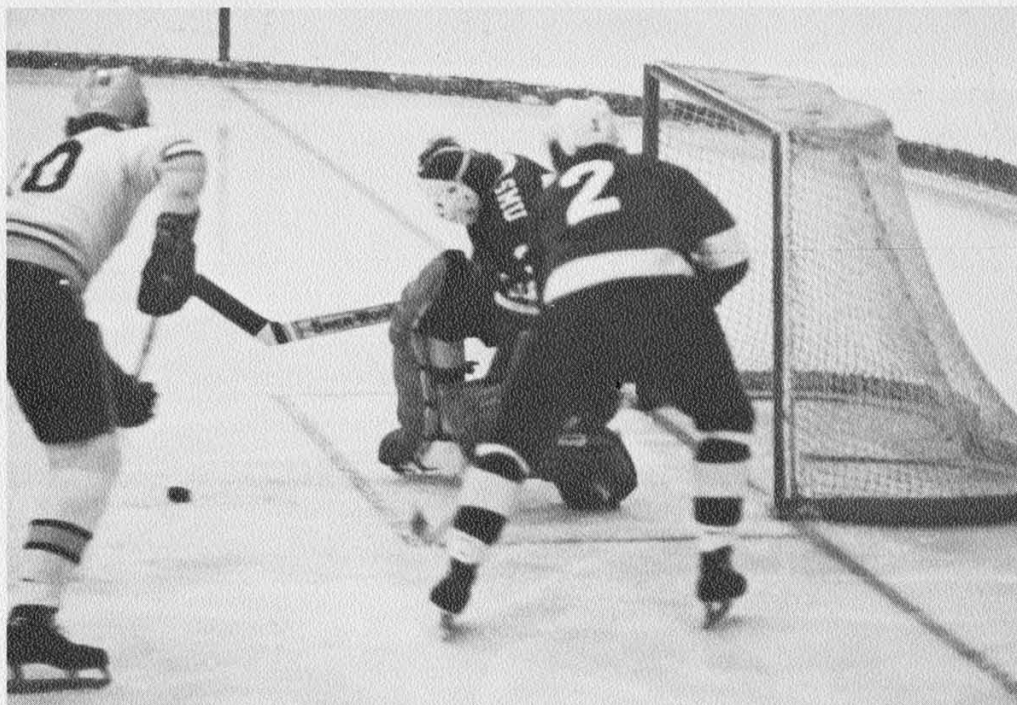


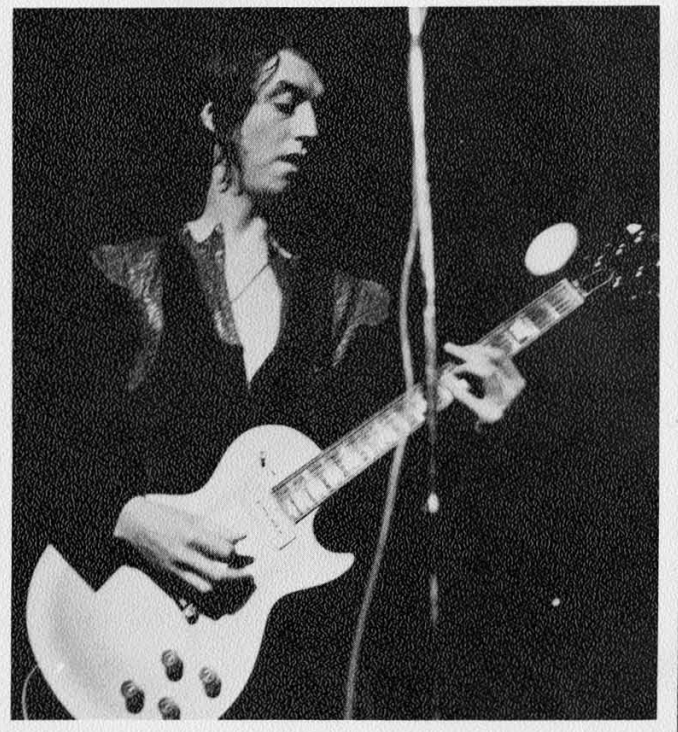
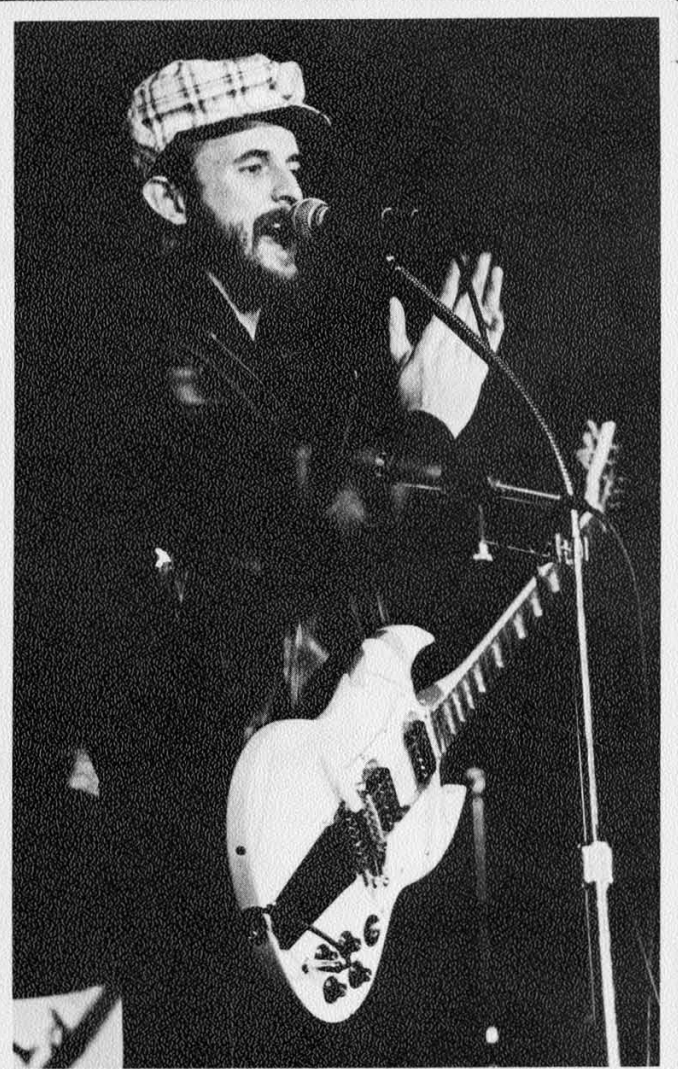
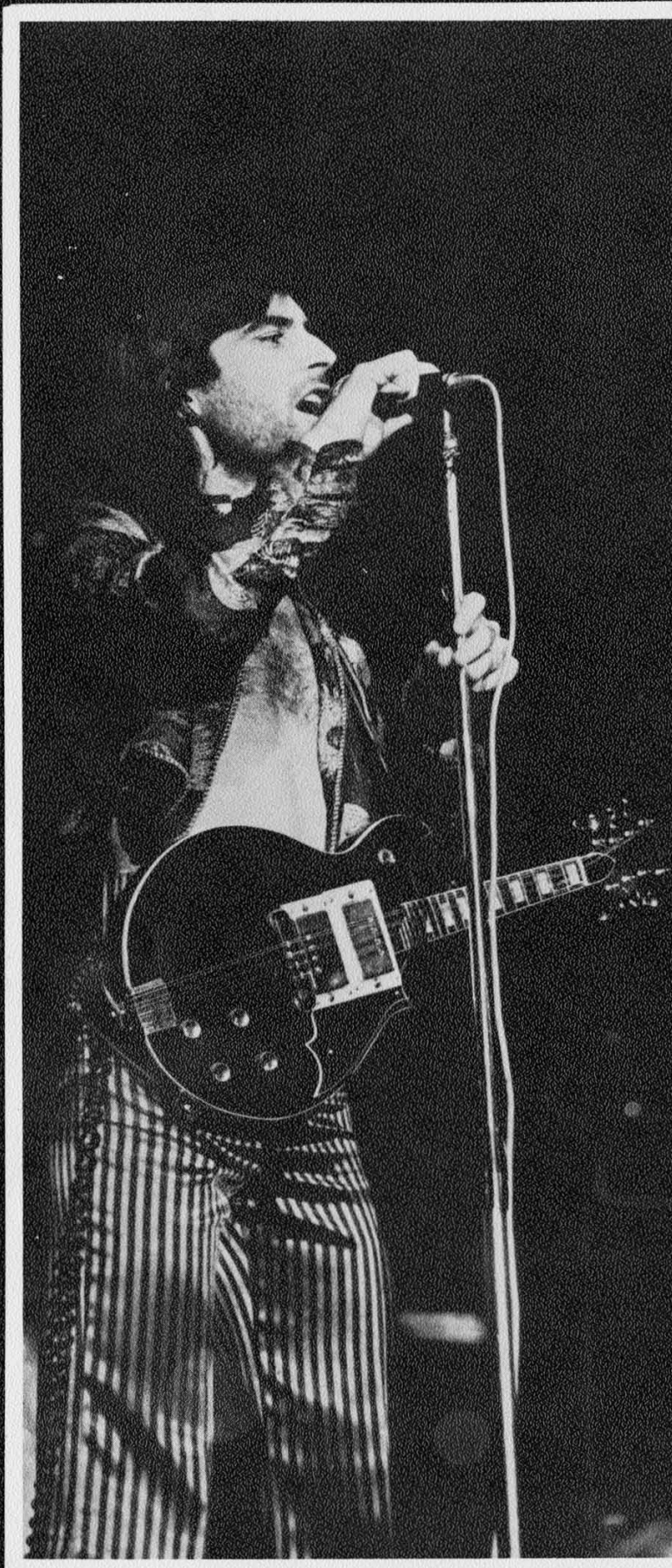
Another bright note on the varsity sports scene this year was the play of the hockey Tigers. This year coach Pierre Page brought his team through the league schedule with a record of 12 wins and 6 losses and a berth in the AIAA playoffs. Season play saw the Tigers drop two games to St. Mary's 7-3 and 3-1, two games to Acadia 4-2 and 7-3, and one each to St. Francis Xavier 5-4, and the University of Moncton 5-3. On the plus side of the scoreboard, the Tigers won two games against Memorial 5-0 and 6-5, University of Prince Edward Island 6-2 and 5-4, Saint Thomas University 10-2 and 10-2, University of New Brunswick 5-1 and 5-2, and Mount Allison 4-3 and 3-2; and one game each against St. F.X. 4-0 and University of Moncton 5-2.

This year's club was built around a solid core of talent consisting of defenceman Rick Roemer, forwards Bob Richardson and Randy Sears, and goaltender Vince Desjardins all of whom had tryouts with the National Student Hockey Team. Desjardins combined with Greg Lynch to handle the net-minding duties and they provided Dalhousie with the top defensive record by virtue of their many stellar performances. The play of newcomers such as Jim Shatford and Dan Flynn was an added bonus to the Tiger's offense this year. Next year's prospects seem very good as many members will be back with the club however a great loss will be experienced with the departure of Pierre Page as coach.









The Irish group Horslips forced many observers to reassess the relationship between folk and rock music. Although incorporating Irish melodies and occasionally using folk instruments such as the concertina, fiddle,

bodhran drum, and Irish pipes, Horslips will be remembered primarily as one of the most unique and solid rock bands to play at Dal for some time.

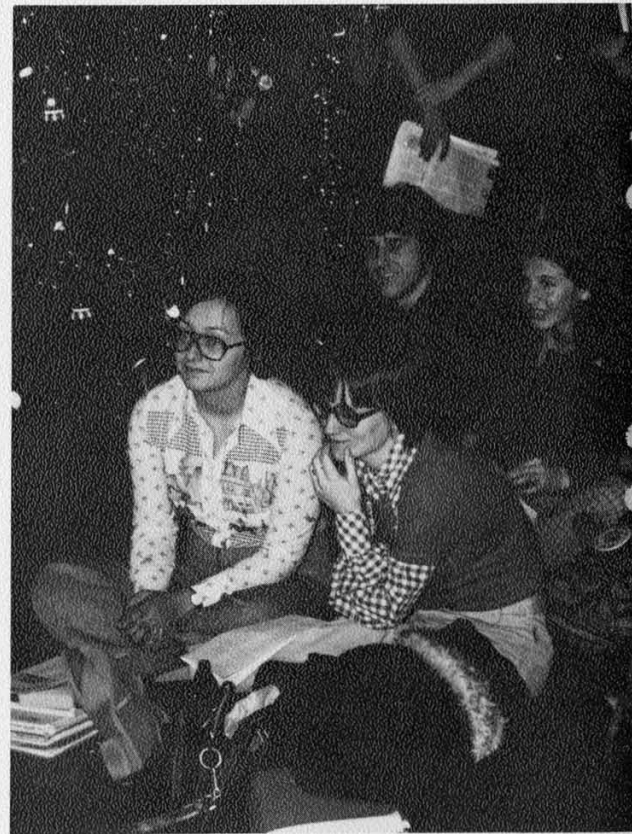


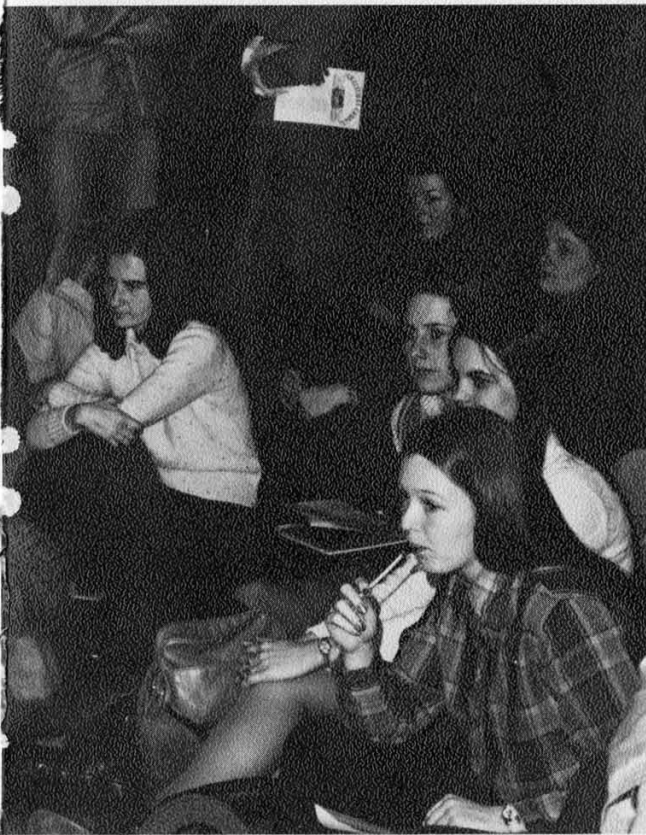




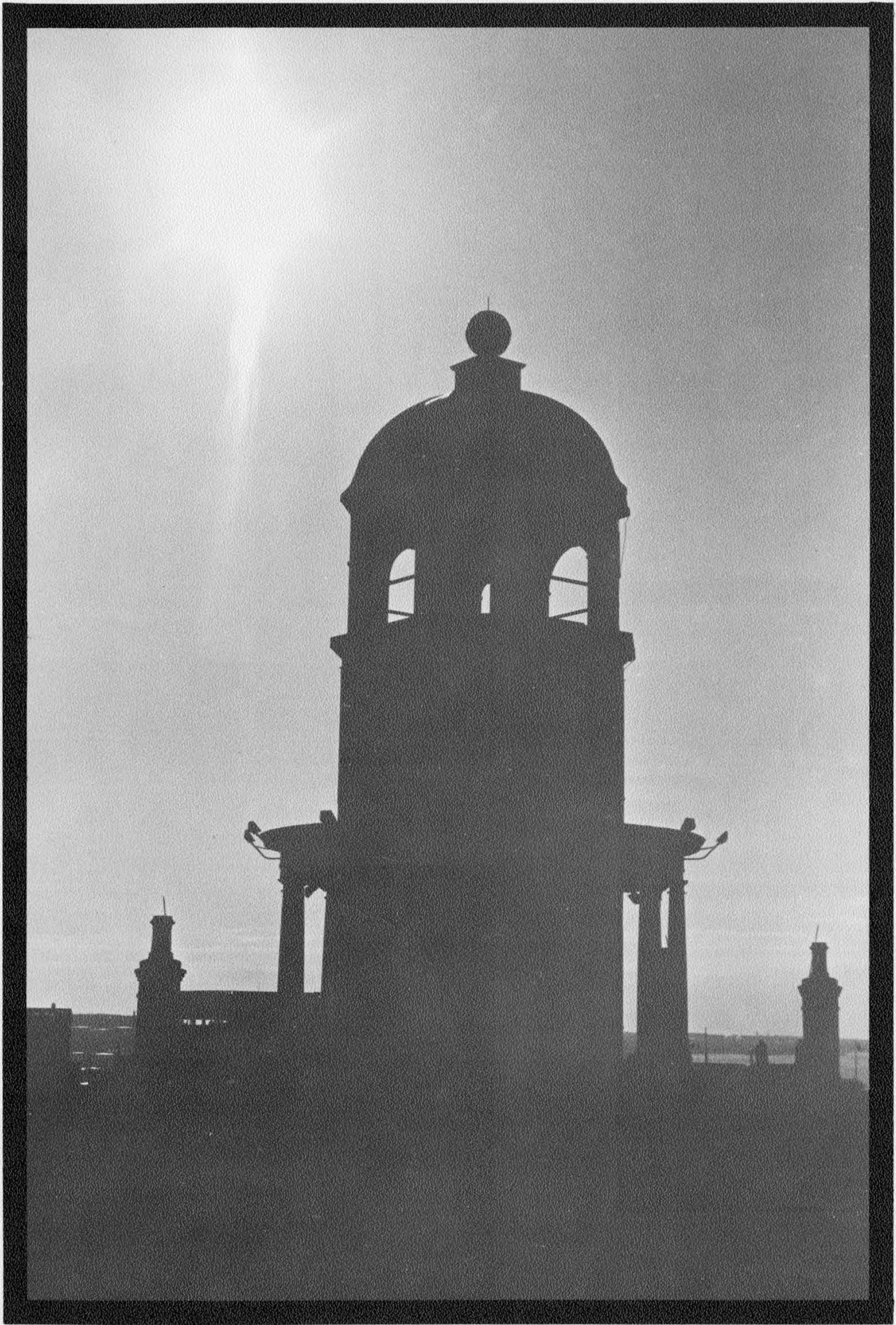
