GROUPE POUR L'INVENTAIRE ARCHITECTURAL
OTTAWA

Afin de disséminer de l'information concernant des collections de documents architecturaux, les Archives publiques du Canada, Héritage Canada, "Ontario Heritage Foundation", le chapitre d'Ottawa de l'Association des architectes de l'Ontario et la SEAC ont subventionné la compilation d'un inventaire de dessins, de normes, de correspondance ainsi que de d'autres documents architecturaux que possèdent différentes organisations d'Ottawa.

Le groupe responsable de ce travail est composé de quatre étudiants de l'Université Carleton et sont sous la supervision de Harold Kalman.

Le groupe a créé un système de référence c'est-à-dire un fichier central muni d'une série de renvois. Ils ont aussi préparé un rapport, un livre et un inventaire publié en 6 volumes. L'information que vous trouverez dans l'inventaire comprend des informations concernant l'architecte, de l'information sur la firme où est situé le bâtiment et quel est le type du bâtiment.

Jusqu'à présent le groupe a obtenu de bons résultats; donc on veut poursuivre le projet. On pense même en élargir son champs d'activité en y ajoutant d'autres sujets de recherches tel que réunir de l'information sur les contracteurs, les compagnies de construction etc.

ARCHIVES NATIONALES (ARCHITECTURE)
JUILLET 1977

Les archives nationales pour l'architecture ont récemment fait l'acquisition de la collection de dessins architecturaux de Frederick John Alexander. Celui-ci a fait ses débuts, en tant qu'architecte, en Angleterre et par la suite vient s'installer à Ottawa où il travaille pour le ministère des Travaux publics. C'est durant cette période qu'il est impliqué dans le conception de l'intérieur de la bibliothèque du Parlement.

Cette collection n'est pas volumineuse par contre elle est très intéressante. Elle comprend des plans de plusieurs bâtiments commerciaux et résidentiels de la région d'Ottawa. Elle sera mise à la disposition des chercheurs, sous peu.

OTTAWA ARCHITECTURAL INVENTORY GROUP

In order to disseminate information on collections of architectural material, the Public Archives of Canada, Heritage Ottawa, the Ontario Heritage Foundation, the Ottawa chapter of the Ontario Association of Architects and the SSAC sponsored the compilation of an inventory of drawings, specifications, correspondence and other architectural records held by various organizations, firms and individuals in Ottawa.

The group responsible for this was composed of four Carleton University students under the supervision of Harold Kalman. Using Peter Arend's list of Ottawa architects and architectural firms and the membership lists from the Ontario Association of Architects, they obtained a fairly complete inventory of names.

The group then visited architectural firms and developed an inventory form linked to a card cross referencing system for easy retrieval of information. Once the inventory of the holdings of architectural offices had been completed, non-architectural institutions such as school boards, religious institutions, governments and private citizens were approached. The cut-off date for the material inventoried is 1950.

The AIG project thus resulted in a report, a manual, a six volume inventory and card index system. The inventory is composed of numbered forms with information on the architect or architectural firm, location of building and building type. In addition the types and volume of records relating to the architect or building are also recorded on the form. The card index is organized to allow easy access to any of these features.

This project will be continued, extending its area of research into a survey of developers, contractors and construction companies. In addition it expects to undertake biographical research on architects and to determine through research whether certain drawings were ever realized as buildings. Students hired by Heritage Ottawa are presently searching 19th and early 20th century newspapers for architectural references.

NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL ARCHITECTURAL ARCHIVES - JULY 1977

The National Architectural Archives recently acquired the Frederick John Alexander collection of architectural drawings. Alexander apprenticed in England and came to Ottawa as a young man, where he worked as an architect in the Department of Public Works. An employee there he was involved in the design of the interior of the Library of Parliament.

The collection of drawings is not large, but it is exquisite. It includes plans for commercial and residential buildings in and around Ottawa. The plans are enhanced by specifications, which also exist for buildings whose plans have not survived. These drawings and accompanying records complement the other architectural collections in the Archives which feature Ottawa buildings.

An inventory and detailed finding aid for the Alexander collection will be prepared and the material will be available to researchers in the near future.

It has recently been brought to our attention that a disparity exists between the size of the SSAC membership and the size of our mailing list for the SSAC Newsletter.
